Forman, North Dakota January 18, 2022

The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met at 9:00 a.m. with the following members present: Jason Arth, Lyle Bopp, Mark Breker, and Scott Johnson. Also present was Wendy Willprecht, Emergency Manager/911 Coordinator; James Peterson, Park Board Chairman; Pam Maloney, Sargent County Auditor. Mary Engst, Sargent County Teller, was present through technology.

Chairman Jason Arth called the meeting to order.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Motion to approve the agenda as amended. (Breker/Bopp) Motion carried unanimously.

Motion to approve the January 4, 2022 minutes as presented. (Bopp/Johnson) Motion carried unanimously.

Richard Ruch, Commissioner, arrived at the meeting.

The board further discussed the purchase and necessity of storm shelters at Silver Lake Park. This would be at an approximate cost of \$34,382.25 and would be split into two budget years, building one in 2022 & one in 2023. Motion to apply for funding for the storm shelters for Silver Lake to be paid in two budget years and to be paid out of Cares Act Funds. (Breker/Bopp) Roll Call Vote: Yes – Arth, Bopp, Breker & Johnson. No – Ruch. Motion carried.

Cindy Klapperich, NDSU Extension Family and Community Wellness Agent, introduced the new Extension Support Staff, Amber Mathison, to the board. Ms. Mathison was newly hired and started her position on January 11.

Motion to use Cares Act funds for the auditorium demolition. (Breker/Ruch) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

The board proceeded to vote on the motion tabled at the January 4, 2022 meeting. The motion was to eliminate the verbiage "and their appointed personal staff" in the Regular Full-Time paragraph within Policy 202 Employment Categories. This motion had been made by Bopp and seconded by Ruch. Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Jayne Pfau, State's Attorney, arrived at the meeting.

Commissioner Bopp reported that a structural engineer from Interstate Engineering has inspected areas of concern within the courthouse, such as crumbling walls and cracks. He stated that these areas are normal for an old building that has done some settling. He suggested re-plastering the areas as the cracks are superficial.

Commissioner Bopp also reported that he is waiting on an estimate for an alternative heat source during the colder winter days. This would be a LP backup unit that would help heat the water when the bricks aren't able to heat up to their full potential during the night. He also stated that he visited with Ottertail Power Company and they have put the county on a regulated rate for electricity, which is a rippled system, where they can ripple our electricity for 5 hours/day.

Alison Toepke, Treasurer/Recorder/Clerk of Court, arrived at the meeting. She stated that Sargent County has been approved for a Courthouse Facility Grant, and therefore will be purchasing air purifiers that were within the approved grant. If the county purchases additional air purifiers, there would be an additional price break for them. Motion to purchase five additional air purifiers for other main offices within the courthouse. (Bopp/Johnson) Roll Call Vote: Yes – Bopp, Johnson and Ruch. No – Arth & Breker. Motion carried. After conferring with Brenda Peterson, Health Unit Administrator, motion to increase the purchase of five air purifiers to six air purifiers. (Bopp/Johnson) Roll Call Vote: Yes – Bopp, Johnson, and Ruch. No – Arth & Breker. Motion carried.

Motion to purchase additional an additional software module – Mobile Home Depreciation – from Tyler Technologies. (Breker/Ruch) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

The board reviewed the letter received from Mike Verdoorn, Gallagher Benefits, regarding compensation studies and job evaluations. After reviewing road department job descriptions from other counties, it was suggested that the road supervisor review Sargent County's job descriptions and make some revisions.

Motion to authorize the chairman and the auditor to sign the Certification of Local Match for Bridge Inspections/Load Ratings. (Ruch/Bopp) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

The board reviewed a listing of safety clothing/equipment that Dickey County provides for their road department. The board will look this over at budget time and make a decision about appropriations at that time.

Ray Bauer, Harlem Township Resident, arrived at the meeting. He had questions regarding inundated land. Denise Ferderer, Tax Director, was called into the meeting and she stated that her office receives a map from NRCS and that is the map that is used to determine who qualifies for inundated land reductions.

Motion to approve County Deeds for the land sold at the November Tax Forfeiture Land Sale. (Bopp/ Johnson) Upon roll call vote, motion carried.

Motion to approve the hiring of Landon Evenson as Road Department Equipment Operator at Grade B22/Step 3, moving to Step 4 once he receives his CDL license, pending a negative drug test. (Ruch/ Breker) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Tim Faber, Road Supervisor, arrived at the meeting. He stated that the road crew has been out plowing roads and trying to keep up with all the snow & wind. He stated that he was going to try to rent a snowblower for the Bobcat until the tractor snowblower is fixed, as they are waiting for parts.

There was discussion regarding fences in the county road right-of-way, which can get in the way when pushing snow. Commissioner Breker and the road supervisor will work with the landowners.

Motion to instruct the county auditor to call for sealed bids in the official newspaper for furnishing supplies for the period beginning April 1, 2022 and ending March 31, 2023. Bids shall be opened on March 15, 2022 as follows: Gravel (with the stipulation that all graveling be done by October 1, 2022 and all bills received by December 1, 2022)-11:00 a.m.; Mixing & Drying Blacktop Surfacing-11:20 a.m.; Bituminous Materials-11:25 a.m.; Bulk purchase of 10% Blended Ethanol gasoline, Fuel, Biodiesel Blend/10% bio-diesel with 90% petroleum diesel or "B10" & LP Gas-11:30 a.m. (Breker/Bopp) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Bopp stated that there has been one candidate interviewed for the Human Resources Director position, and another one will be interviewed this afternoon.

Approve January payroll in the sum of \$225,537.54 and the following bills. (Bopp/Breker). Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.
