THE BOARD THEN PROCEEDED TO ACT ON THE BID FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A BRIDGE BETWEEN SECTION 25 IN HALL TOWNSHIP AND SECTION 30 IN WYNDMERE TOWNSHIP, RICHLAND COUNTY, SUBMITTED BY JARDINE BRIDGE COMPA-NY, MARCH 6, 1945, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,938.00, ACTION ON SAME HAVING BEEN DEFERRED UNTIL THE APRIL MEETING.

ON MOTION THE BOARD REJECTED SAID BID.

On motion the Board approved the application of Percy  $\mathbb W$ . Kast for license to sell beer on Lots 1-2, BLOCK I, VILLAGE OF VEDA, FOR THE PERIOD ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1945.
