Elected State officials may individually elect to adopt this system by application to the Bureau for such coverage. Such coverage may, at the option of the applicant, be made retroactive to January 1, 1950, upon payment by the applicant of his accrued contribution for the retroactive perion."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY HEREBY ELECT COVERAGE FOR ALL ELECTIO OFFICIALS AS PROVIDED IN THE ABOVE QUOTED SECTION OF THE NORTH DAKOTA OLD AGE AND SURVIVOR INSURANCE SYSTEM LAW EFFECTIVE AS OF JANUARY 1, 1952."
