Whereas, the State Highway Department contemplates the improvement or construction of a part of its highway system within this county in connection with what is known as Highway Project F-692 (State Highway No. 11 from Forman to Cogswell and west), and such improvement or construction will require the acquisition by the State of Lands for right of way or borrow pits within the county,

BE IT, THEREFORE, RESOLVED THAT THIS COUNTY PAY 50% OF THE ACTUAL COST OF SUCH LANDS, WHETHER ACQUIRED BY CONDEMNATION PROCEEDINGS OR BY DIRECT PURCHASES FROM THE OWNERS OF THE SAME, INCLUDING SUCH SUMS AS MAY BE PAID AND ALLOWED SUCH OWNERS ON ACCOUNT OF DAMAGES TO IMPROVEMENTS, REMOVAL OF IMPROVEMENTS OR OTHER ALLOWABLE DAMAGES UNDER THE LAW OF EMINENT DOMAIN OF THIS STATE, INCLUDING LANDS ACQUIRED BY PURCHASE AT WHAT IS DEEMED A REASONABLE VALUATION BY THE STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT IF SAID LANDS TO BE ACQUIRED FOR HIGHWAY PURPOSES ARE ACQUIRED BY THIS COUNTY OR ITS BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR AND IN BEHALF OF THE STATE, AND PAID FOR WITH COUNTY FUNDS, THE COUNTY AUDITOR SHALL PRESENT, AS SOON AS CONVENIENTLY MAY BE AFTER SUCH PAYMENT, TO THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, PROPER VOUCHER FOR REIMBURSEMENT TO THIS COUNTY OF 50% OF THE COUNTY FUNDS SO EXPENDED THEREFOR; AND, IF SAID LANDS OR ANY OF THEM ARE ACQUIRED AND PAID FOR BY THE STATE, OR ITS STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT OUT OF STATE FUNDS, THEN THE COUNTY AUDITOR UPON PRESENTATION TO HIM OF A VOUCHER DULY CERTIFIED BY THE STATE HIGHWAY ENGINEER OF SAID STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, SHALL, AND HE IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO DRAW AND DELIVER TO THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, BHALL, AND HE IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO DRAW AND DELIVER TO THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT DUE AND PROPER COUNTY WARRANT OF THIS COUNTY FOR 50% OF THE ACTUAL TOTAL COST OF SAID LANDS SO PAID FOR BY THE STATE OR ITS STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.

On roll call all members present voted in favor of said Resolution, and the same was dechared duly carried and adopted.

Commissioner Smith introduced the following resolution, and seconded by Commissioner Walstead, moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, IN ORDER TO AVAIL ITSELF OF FEDERAL FUNDS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF RECONSTRUCTION OF HIGHWAYS OFF, AND/OR ON THE STATE HIGHWAY SESTEM, IT IS NECESSARY THAT THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT DESIGNATE REVISION OF THE FEDERAL AID SECONDARY MIGHWAY SYSTEM WITHIN THE STATE, AND

WHEREAB, SUCH DESIGNATION WILL REQUIRE THE APPROVAL BY THE COUNTY OF THE REVISIONS OF THE FEDERAL AID SECONDARY HIGHWAY SYSTEM WITHIN THIS COUNTY,

BE IT, THEREFORE, RESOLVED THAT THIS COUNTY APPROVES THE DESIGNATION OF THE REVISIONS OF THE FEDERAL AID SECONDARY HIGHWAY SYSTEM AS SHOWN ON THE ATTACHED MAP AND DESCRIBED IN THE ATTACHED TABULATION. (FROM THE CORNER OF 4TH AVE. AND 1ST STREET IN COGSWELL NORTHERLY TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SEC. 2-130-57, APPROXIMATELY 0.24 MILES.)

ON ROLL CALL ALL THE COMMISSIONERS VOTED IN FAVOR OF SAID RESOLUTION AND SAME WAS ADOPTED.
