THE COUNTY OF SARGENT, STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE COUNTY, AND THE NORTH DAKOTA STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE DEPARTMENT, AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. THE DEPARTMENT WILL TAKE ALL STEPS NECESSARY TOWARD SECURING COOPERATION WITH THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT IN ORDER TO OBTAIN FEDERAL FUNDS TO THE EXTENT PROVIDED IN THE FEDERAL-AID HIGHWAY ACT OF 1944, OR OTHER SUBSEQUENT FEDERAL-AID HIGHWAY ACTS, WHICH AUTHORIZE APPROPRIATIONS FOR CONTINUING THE CONSTRUCTION OF HIGHWAYS ON THE COUNTY FEDERAL-AID SECONDARY SYSTEM, FOR THE FOLLOWING DESCRIBED FEDERAL-AID SECONDARY PROJECT No. S 113(2) GRADE ON A COUNTY ROAD FROM BRAMPTON NORTH TO COGSWELL
- 2. THE COUNTY WILL PAY ALL CONSTRUCTION COSTS EXCEPT THE AMOUNT PAID BY THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT THROUGH THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS AND, IF THE DEPARTMENT ADVANCES ANY PAYMENT IN BEHALF OF THE COUNTY TO THE CONTRACTOR OR ANY OTHER PARTIES WHICH ARE LATER FOUND NON-COLLECTABLE FROM THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS, THE COUNTY WILL REIMBURSE THE DEPARTMENT FOR FUNDS SO ADVANCED. THE TERM "CONSTRUCTION" MEANS THE SUPERVISING. INSPECTING, ACTUAL BUILDING AND ALL EXPENSES INCIDENTAL TO THE CONSTRUCTION OF RECONSTRUCTION OF THE HIGHWAY INCLUDING LOCATING, SURVEYING, MAPPING COSTS OF RIGHTS-OF-WAY, COSTS OF ADVERTISING AND THE COST OF ALL OTHER WORK NECESSARY TO COMPLETE THE PROJECT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS.
- 3. THE COUNTY AGREES TO MAKE BINDING AND A PART OF THIS AGREEMENT ALL PROVISION OF RESOLUTIONS EXECUTED BY THE COUNTY AFFECTING THIS PROJECT OR RELATING TO THE MAINTENANCE OF ANY PORTION OF THE COUNTY'S FEDERAL-AID SECONDARY SYSTEM.
- 4. THE COUNTY WILL, AT ITS EXPENSE AND WITHOUT FEDERAL-AID REIMBURSEMENT, ACQUIRE THE NECESSARY RIGHTS-OF WAY.
- 5. ADEQUATE ENGINEERING, SUPERVISION AND INSPECTION SHALL BE PROVIDED BY THE COUNTY UNDER THE GENERAL DIRECTION AND CONTROL OF THE DEPARTMENT, AND THE COUNTY SHALL MAKE SUCH REPORTS, KEEP SUCH RECORDS AND PERFORM SUCH WORK IN THE MANNER AND TIME AS THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REQUEST AND DIRECT SO AS TO ENABLE THE DEPARTMENT, AS THE AGENT OF THE COUNTY, TO COLLECT FOR THE COUNTY THE FEDERAL-AID EARNED.
- 6. Required tests of all materials entering into the construction of the project shall be made by OR UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT TESTING LABORATORY. IT IS THE COUNTY'S RESPONSIBILITY TO SEETHAT THE REQUIRED NUMBER OF SAMPLES ARE TAKEN IN A SATISFACTORY MANNER AND PROPERLY SUBMITTED FOR TESTING.
- 7. FEDERAL FUNDS WILL ONLY PARTICIPATE IN WORK PERFORMED SUBSEQUENT TO AUTHORIZATION BY THE DISTRICT ENGINEER OF THE BUREAU OF FUBLIC ROADS AND THE DEPARTMENT.
- 8. An engineering and clerical charge of 1% of the total cost of the project will be made by the STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT WHICH THE COUNTY AGREES TO PAY UPON COMPLETION OF THE PROJECT.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD AND COUNTY AUDITOR ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO BIGN THIS AGREEMENT. COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE BOARD ENTER INTO THE FOLLOWING AGREEMENT:

THE COUNTY OF SARGENT, STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE COUNTY, AND THE NORTH DAKOTA STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That the Highway Department will submit a project for the improvement of 8.023 miles of the COUNTY FEDERAL-AID SECONDARY HIGHWAY PROJECT, GRADE ON COUNTY ROAD FROM BRAMPTON NORTH TO COGSWELL AND TO BE DEBIGNATED AS NORTH DAKOTA PROJECT NO. S 113(2), AND WILL RECOMMEND ITB APPROVAL BY THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA FOR CONSTRUCTION WITH FUNDS APPORTIONED TO THE STATE UNDER THE FEDERAL HIGHWAY ACT AS AMENDED AND SUPPLEMENTED; SUBJECT, HOWEVER, TO THE CONDITION THAT THE COUNTY SHALL PROVIDE FOR ITS PROPER MAINTENANCE AFTER COMPLETION OF ITS IMPROVEMENT.
- 2. THAT THE SAID COUNTY HEREBY REQUESTS THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT TO SUBMIT THE AFOREMENTIONED PRO-JECT WITH RECOMMENDATION THAT IT BE APPROVED BY THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, AND AGREES THAT IF SUCH PROJECT IS APPROVED AND CONSTRUCTED BY THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT AND THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA IT THEREAFTER, AT ITS OWN COST AND EXPENSE, WILL MAINTAIN THE PROJECT IN A MANNER SATISFACTORY TO THEM, OR THEIR AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES, AND WILL MAKE AMPLE PROVISION EACH YEAR FOR SUCH MAINTENANCE.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD AND COUNTY AUDITOR ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND INSTRUCTED TO SIGN BAID AGREE-MENT.

COMMISSIONER MARQUETTE SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER SMITH MOVED THAT THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD BE AUTHORIZED TO CERTIFY TO THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT THAT ALL NECESSARY RIGHTS OF WAY HAVE BEEN ACQUIRED FOR FAS PROJECT No. S 113(2), BRAMPTON NORTH TO COGS-WELL.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER SMITH INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS SARGENT COUNTY, WEBER TOWNSHIP AND THE VILLAGE OF HAVANA, ARE THE OWNERS IN COMMON OF THE No OF SET OF SEC. 27-129-55. WEBER TOWNSHIP, IN THE FOLLOWING PROPORTIONS TO WIT: SARGENT COUNTY AN UNDIVIDED 2/5TH; WEBER TOWNSHIP AN UNDIVIDED 2/5TH AND THE VILLAGE OF HAVANA AN UN-

DIVIDED 1/5TH AND WHEREAS THE RESPECTIVE GOVERNING BOARDS OF THE ABOVE MENTIONED MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS HAVE BY RESOLU-

TIONS DULY ADOPTED, AGREED TO BELL THE SAID DESCRIBED LAND, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, THAT SARGENT COUNTY ALSO AGREE TO SELL THIS LAND AND THAT THE COUNTY AUDITOR BE INSTRUCTED TO PUBLISH NOTICE IN THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER OF THE COUNTY, CALLING FOR SEALED BIDS FOR THE SALE OF SAID LAND, SUCH BIDS TO BE OPENED AT 2 O'CLOCK, P. M., APRIL 22, 1957.

TERMS: CASH OR 1/3 CASH AND BALANCE TO BE PAID WITHIN 3 YEARS FROM DATE OF PURCHASE; UNPAID BALANCE TO BEAR INTEREST AT THE RATE OF 4% PER ANNUM UNTIL PAID.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED.

THE OFFICIAL OATH OF OFFICE WAS ADMINISTERED TO R. W. SAFSTROM, AS COUNTY AUDITOR, FOR THE ENSUING TWO EAR TERM, AND HIS BOND IN THE SUM OF \$10,000.00, WITH THE STATE BONDING FUND AS SURETY, WAS ON MOTION APPROVED BY THE BOARD.
