

FORMAN, N.DAK. JANUARY 3RD, 1961

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

THE BOARD WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY RALPH SEAVERT, COUNTY AUDITOR, AND PROCEEDED TO ORGANIZE FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

THE OFFICIAL OATH OF OFFICE WAS ADMINISTERED TO THE FOLLOWING COMMISSIONERS WHO WERE ELECTED AT THE GENERAL ELECTION HELD NOVEMBER 8TH, 1960, FOR A TERM OF FOUR YEARS.
MELVIN SMITH, 4TH DISTRICT, G.B. COLEMAN, 5TH DISTRICT.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO ELECT A CHAIRMAN FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.
MOTION BY COMMISSIONER ENGE AND SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER HOFLEN THAT COMMISSIONER SMITH BE ELECTED CHAIRMAN FOR THE ENSUING YEAR. ON ROLL CALL VOTE, COMMISSIONERS WALSTEAD, ENGE AND HOFLEN VOTED "AYE", COMMISSIONERS COLEMAN AND SMITH VOTED "NAY". THE MOTION CARRIED AND COMMISSIONER SMITH WAS DULY DECLARED ELECTED CHAIRMAN FOR THE YEAR 1961.

THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING WERE READ AND ON MOTION APPROVED AS READ.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN MOVED THAT THE ORDER OF BUSINESS FOR THE ENSUING YEAR, AS PROVIDED BY CHAPTER 11-1136, OF THE N.D. CENTURY CODE BE ADOPTED BY THE BOARD.
COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN MOVED THAT COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD BE APPOINTED COURTHOUSE COMMISSIONER FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.
COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT EACH COMMISSIONER BE APPOINTED ROAD AND BRIDGE COMMISSIONER IN AND FOR HIS OWN DISTRICT, WITH POWER TO CALL TO HIS ASSISTANCE, COMMISSIONERS FROM OTHER DISTRICTS TO ACT WITH HIM WHEN NECESSARY.
COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE FORMAN TOWNSHIP BOARD MET WITH THE COMMISSIONERS IN REGARDS TO HIGHWAY PROBLEMS.

A DELEGATION FROM THE COGSWELL GUN CLUB MET WITH THE BOARD AND REQUESTED COOPERATION IN SECURING THREE MORE BUFFALOES FROM THE FEDERAL WILDLIFE SERVICE.
THE COMMISSIONERS AGREED TO GIVE THEIR FULL COOPERATION.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE COUNTY AUDITOR BE AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO PAY BY AUDITOR'S WARRANTS THE FOLLOWING:

ALL SALARIES, INCLUDING JANITORS AND CLERK HIRE AS FIXED BY THE BOARD AND APPROVED IN THE VARIOUS BUDGET REQUESTS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1ST, 1960, OR BY LEGISLATIVE ENACTMENT.
ALL ORDERS PRESENTED BY THE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD TO BE PAID OUT OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE FUND.
ALL BILLS FOR TELEPHONE, LIGHT AND POWER AND ALL WITHHOLDING AND SOCIAL SECURITY TAXES WITHHELD OUT OF WAGES TO THE PROPER AUTHORITIES.
COMMISSIONER ENGE SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD NEXT PROCEEDED TO CONSIDER THE APPOINTMENT OF AN INSANITY COMMISSIONER AND SUPERINTENDENT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN MOVED THAT DONALD J. FEIST, M.D. BE APPOINTED INSANITY COMMISSIONER FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.
COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT DONALD J. FEIST, M.D. BE APPOINTED SUPERINTENDENT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH FOR THE ENSUING YEAR, SALARY TO BE \$300.00 PER YEAR, WITH MILEAGE AS PRESCRIBED BY LAW.
COMMISSIONER ENGE SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE PUBLIC DEPOSITARY AGREEMENT, FOR PLEDGE OF ASSETS AS SECURITY FOR COUNTY FUNDS, IN THE SARGENT COUNTY BANK, COVERING \$100,000.00 U.S. TREASURY NOTE SERIES A 1964 - 4 3/4 %, DUE MAY 15H, 1964 #1270 @ 110M, WITH NORTHWESTERN NATIONAL BANK OF MINNEAPOLIS, MINN., AS CUSTODIAN, AND THE FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF MINNOR, N.DAK. COVERING U.S. TREASURY NOTES SERIES A-63 - 2 5/8 % DUE FEB. 15TH 1963 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$25,000.00 AND U.S. TREASURY BONDS OF 1980 - 4 % DUE FEB. 15TH, 1980 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$25,000.00 WITH THE FEDERAL RESERVE BANK OF MINNEAPOLIS, AS CUSTODIAN, BE APPROVED AS TO SUFFICIENCY ACCORDING LAW.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN MOVED THAT THE APPLICATIONS FOR ABATEMENT OF SCHOOL POLL TAXES FOR THE YEAR 1960 BY THEO. BREKER FOR THE SUM OF \$2.00 IN THE TOWNSHIP OF KINGSTON AND RALPH KIEFER FOR THE SUM OF \$2.00 IN THE TOWNSHIP OF TEWAUKON, BE APPROVED FOR THE REASON THAT THE APPLICANTS HAD BEEN ASSESSED TWO SCHOOL POLLS EACH IN THE VALLAGE OF CAYUGA.

CENTURY CODE, ALSO BE PUBLISHED IN THE SARGENT COUNTY NEWS ACCORDING TO PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 46-0503 OF THE N.D. CENTURY CODE.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE FOLLOWING LICENSE TO SELL BEER " ON & OFF " SALE , BE APPROVED FOR THE PERIOD ENDING DECEMBER 31ST, 1961.

KEITH NEPSTAD, ON LOTS 6 & 7, BLOCK 1, VILLAGE OF STRAUSVILLE.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION; THE MOTION WAS SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER COLEMAN AND CARRIED. ALL COMMISSIONERS VOTED AYE ON ROLL CALL VOTE.

WHEREAS CHAPTER 57-2221 N.D. CENTURY CODE PROVIDES THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SHALL AT ITS JANUARY MEETING, DECLARE BY RESOLUTION THAT ALL UNPAID AND CANCELLED PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES, SHALL CONSTITUTE A LIEN ON ANY REAL ESTATE OWNED BY THE TAX DEBTOR, FROM AND AFTER THE DATE OF EXTENSION AND ENTRY THEROF, BY THE COUNTY AUDITOR UPON THE TAX LIST OF THE NEXT PRECEDING YEAR, OPPOSITE THE DESCRIPTIONS OF THE REAL ESTATE DESIGNATED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, BELONGING TO ANY PERSON, COMPANY OR CORPORATION OWING SUCH UNCOLLECTED PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES, THE YEAR OR YEARS FOR WHICH THE TAX REMAINS DUE AND THE PRINCIPAL SUM OF SUCH TAX; AND THAT SUCH ENTRY SHALL BE MADE WITHOUT REGARD TO ANY PRIOR PAYMENT OF REAL ESTATE TAXES ON SAID DESCRIPTIONS FOR THE PRECEDING YEAR, AND THE COUNTY TREASURER SHALL BE WITHOUT AUTHORITY THEREAFTER TO ISSUE ANY RECEIPT IN FULL FOR SAID REAL ESTATE TAXES WITHOUT MAKING COLLECTION AT THE SAME TIME OF THE PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES SO EXTENDED, AND

WHEREAS; SAID BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS HAVE CANCELLED SAID UNCOLLECTIBLE DELINQUENT PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES AT ITS JANUARY MEETING AS PROVIDED BY LAW,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED; THAT ALL UNPAID AND UNCOLLECTED DELINQUENT PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES FROM AND AFTER THE DATE OF EXTENSION AND ENTRY THEROF AS PROVIDED IN THE FOREGOING SHALL CONSTITUTE A LIEN ON ANY REAL ESTATE OWNED BY THE TAX DELINQUENT, OR WHICH MAY THEREAFTER BE ACQUIRED BY THE TAX DELINQUENT, AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED; THAT THE FOLLOWING PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES OWED SHALL BE A SPECIFIC LIEN UPON THE PROPERTY DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS;

JANUARY 17TH, 1961, IN THE COURTROOMS IN THE COURTHOUSE IN FORMAN, N.DAK.

ALL MEMBERS OF THE RICHLAND AND SARGENT COUNTY BOARDS OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS WERE PRESENT.

THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY ROBERT A. CASE, STATE'S ATTORNEY OF SARGENT COUNTY, AFTER WHICH THE BOUNDARIES OF THE KINGSTON AND MARBOE SCHOOL DISTRICTS WERE READ INCLUDING THE NOTICE OF HEARING.
