The Sargent County Board of Commissioners reconvened the recessed January 8th, 2019, meeting in the Commissioner's Room at the Sargent County Courthouse at 9:05 a.m. with the following members present: Bill Anderson; Jason Arth; Lyle Bopp; and, Richard Ruch. Jerry Waswick was absent. Also present were Jayne Pfau, State's Attorney; Jeanne Sexton-Brown, Sargent County Teller; and, Pam Maloney, Sargent County Auditor. The meeting was adjourned at 9:06 a.m.

Jason Arth, Chairman, called the January 22nd meeting of the Sargent County Commission to order at 9:07 a.m.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Darci Weber, Social Services Director, arrived at the meeting to inquire about the lack of heat in the courthouse. She was assured that the courthouse commissioner and the custodian have been working on the problem, in consultation with Johnson Controls.

Approve January 8, 2019 meeting minutes as corrected. (Bopp/Ruch, unanimous)

Motion to approve Sheriff's Deputy Rick Bryant's request for a 30 days leave of absence beginning January 16th, 2019, pursuant to Policy 606 in the Sargent County Employee Handbook. Said leave is without pay or benefits. (Anderson/Ruch) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Motion to instruct the county auditor to call for sealed bids in the official newspaper for furnishing supplies for the period beginning April 1, 2019 and ending March 31, 2020. Bids shall be opened on March 19, 2019 as follows: Gravel (with the stipulation that all graveling be done by October 1, 2019)-11:00 a.m.; Mixing & Drying Blacktop Surfacing-11:20 a.m.; Bituminous Materials-11:25 a.m.; Bulk purchase of 10% Blended Ethanol gasoline, Fuel, Diesel Exhaust Fluid (DEF), Biodiesel Blend/10% bio-diesel with 90% petroleum diesel or "B10" & LP Gas-11:30 a.m. (Anderson/Bopp) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Alison Toepke, Treasurer/Recorder/Clerk of Court, arrived at the meeting. She informed the commission that the Court Facilities Improvement Grant Committee will be meeting at the end of this week, so it should be known by next week whether Sargent County has been approved for the Wi-Fi equipment acquisition and installation grant request that had been submitted prior to the end of December, 2018. Ms. Toepke has contacted NRG to obtain an updated quote, so the county may get it ordered as soon as notification has been received from the grant committee. The equipment has been budgeted for, so the county will proceed whether or not the grant is awarded. Motion to proceed with the acquisition of the equipment needed for installation of Wi-Fi throughout the courthouse after the decision has been received from the Court Facilities Improvement Grant Committee. (Anderson/Bopp) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Toepke also asked the commissioners if they had any further questions regarding the new pay plan implementation costs after she had sent them additional clarifying information. Motion to approve the implementation of the pay plan with the regression schedule and budget projections transmitted to the county commissioners last week which amounted to approximately \$122,000, an amount which is slightly less than the amount budgeted for pay plan implementation and pay increases for 2019. (Anderson/Bopp) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Pfau stated that another minor change, the addition of a suite number, had been made to the lease between Sargent County and the Wild Rice Soil Conservation District. Motion to approve the amendment to the lease and to authorize the chairman and the county auditor to sign the amended lease. (Bopp/Anderson) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Motion to authorize the courthouse commissioner to solicit estimates to replace the carpet in the former extension office suite, now the States Attorney's office suite, in the northeast corner of the 2^{nd} floor of the courthouse, and, after choosing the best estimate received, to have the carpet purchased and installed as soon as possible. (Anderson/Ruch) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Motion to authorize the chairman to sign the Final Project Certifications and Project Reimbursement letters for SB 2103 & HB 1176 road projects. (Anderson/Ruch) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Approve January payroll in the sum of \$209,044.27 (Nos. 15857-15913 & 78128-78138) and the following bills: (Anderson/Bopp) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Bruce Speich, county resident; and Merrill Engquist, Road Supervisor; arrived at the meeting. Mr. Speich was requesting permission to either bore under County Road #14 or cut the road to place 2 24" culverts according to specifications of the NRCS' engineer. The proposed work concerns a tile drainage project and the flow of water to and through a wetlands mitigation area that is part of the project. There was also a possibility that Mr. Speich could accomplish the aims of the proposed work without boring under or cutting through County #14 at DeLamere by cleaning an existing road ditch going north and east from the county road. After much discussion, it was decided to have Interstate Engineering, Sargent County's engineering firm, take a look at the plans Mr. Speich had provided and make a recommendation for consideration at the February 5th meeting.

Mr. Engquist then provided the commissioners with an inventory of gravel on hand at the different pits. Thorpe -10,000 ton; Hankinson-4,000 ton (which is earmarked for north of Geneseo); Marlowe -5,000 ton (which is earmarked for County Road #12); Storhaug -27,000 ton; & Jorgenson -8,000 ton.

Mr. Engquist also stated that the John Deere tractor that had been rented from Green Iron Equipment at Milnor has been returned, as was required by the rental agreement, and he will be looking to negotiate another lease, or possibly a purchase, depending on what kind of government discounts are available. He was instructed to also check with Titan Machinery, concerning government discount programs that may be available.

There was further discussion on replacing the oldest/most hours motor grader. Motion to authorize the road supervisor and road commissioner to develop specifications to trade one motor grader and to authorize the auditor to advertise for a March 5 bid opening when the specifications have been determined. (Anderson/Bopp) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Travis Paeper, Sheriff, arrived at the meeting to answer questions regarding: Deputy Bryant's leave of absence; a shotgun equipped for law enforcement purposes that was recently purchased from a private party to be installed in one of the department's vehicles; the purchase and use of ammunition; and, certification of marksmanship and firearm use by Sargent County Sheriff's Department personnel.
