January 4, 1983

The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with Commissioners John M. Manikowski, Ardell Johnson, William E. Smith, H. L. Anderson and Magnus Anderson present.

The meeting was called to order by Sherry Hosford, County Auditor, and the Board proceeded to organize for the ensuing year.

The Official Oaths of Office were administered to the following commissioners who were elected at the General Election held November 2, 1982: Magnus Anderson, John M. Manikowski and William E. Smith. Terms to expire December, 1986.

Commissioner Magnus Anderson moved that Ardell Johnson serve as Chairman for the ensuing year. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and moved that the auditor cast a unanimous ballot. Motion carried.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that H. L. Anderson serve as Vice-Chairman. Commissioner Magnus Anderson seconded the motion and moved that the auditor cast a unanimous ballot. Motion carried.

The minutes of the last meeting were read. Commissioner Smith moved that the minutes be approved as read. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

Motion by Commissioner H. L. Anderson and seconded by Commissioner Manikowski that William E. Smith serve as Courthouse Commissioner for 1983. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Magnus Anderson and second by Commissioner Manikowski that H. L. Anderson serve as Weed Commissioner for the ensuing year. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Smith and second by Commissioner Magnus Anderson that John M. Manikowski serve as the Police Commissioner for the ensuing year. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Smith and second by Commissioner H. L. Anderson that Ardell Johnson serve as Road Commissioner for the ensuing year. Each commissioner will also serve as road commissioner in their district. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Magnus Anderson and second by Commissioner Smith that Matthew C. Kidd, MD be re-appointed Superintendent of the Board of Health. Term ending January, 1984. Motion carried.

Commissioner Smith moved that Roger D. Dahlstrom be re-appointed Sargent County Coroner. Term ending January, 1985. Commissioner M. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Public Depository Agreement for pledge of assets as security for County Funds in the Sargent County Bank, Forman, ND and First National Bank, Milnor, ND be approved as to sufficiency according to law. Commissioner M. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

A motion was made by Commissioner M. Anderson to hold regular Sargent County Board of Commission meetings on the first and third Tuesday of each month. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the County Auditor be authorized and directed to pay by Auditor's warrants the following: All bills for telephone, electricity, water, sewer and garbage and all withholding and social security taxes. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that Irene A. Robbins, Sargent County Treasurer, be given the authority to invest county funds. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner M. Anderson moved that the County Auditor be instructed to call for sealed bids in the official newspaper for furnishing supplies, purchasing culverts, etc. for the period beginning April 1, 1983 and ending March 31, 1984. Bids to be opened March 15, 1983 as follows: Culverts 10:30 a.m.; Bridge Plank and Concrete Bridge Decks 11:30 a.m.; Screening, Hauling, Crushing, Loading and Stockpiling Gravel 1:00 p.m.; Mixing, Drying, Laying Blacktop Surfacing 1:15 p.m.; Rental of Bridge Building Equipment and Labor for Bridge Construction Repair 1:30 p.m.; Rental of Highway Building Equipment and Disaster Emergency Snow Removal 1:45 p.m.; Oil, Grease, Tires, Regular and Unleaded Gas, Diesel Fuel and other supplies 2:00 p.m.; LP Gas 2:30 p.m.; Cutting Edges 2:45 p.m.; and Asphalt Supplies 3:15 p.m. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

The Board discussed the present computer system and instructed the auditor to set up a meeting with another company for January 18, 1983.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the Board approve a \$100.00 one time assessment from the National Association of Counties for their services. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the following application for abatement and settlement of taxes be sent to the governing body for their consideration: Ralph C. Even - Parcel in SE Corner of SW 1/4-12-131-57 and Hans W. Odegard - Part of Outlot B, Milnor City. Both applications are requesting Homestead Credit. Commissioner M. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the following transfers be made to supplement county funds: \$6,092.01 from County Road to County Special Highway and \$6,159.90 from County Poor Relief to Social Welfare. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

Patricia Carlen, Clerk of Courts, met with the Board and discussed current procedure used in handling child support checks. The Board agreed with Patty to continue as in the past for the month of January and in February a letter should be sent to all child support payees asking them to remit by a money order or cashiers check. They also advised her to get an opinion from the States Attorney.

William Bosse met with the Board on behalf of the Sargent County Soil Conservation District to see if the county needed any assistance from them in the area of soil erosion. The Board informed Mr. Bosse that there are some problem areas and that they would discuss the problem further in the spring. Mr. Bosse also mentioned that in regards to the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District, it looks like in the mitigation process, they might get along with less acres than originally expected and that work should begin soon on the Taayer Reservoir located in Sargent County.

The appointment of a magistrate for county court was discussed and tabled until the next meeting.


The following bills were audited. Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the bills be paid. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.



The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the minutes be approved as corrected. Commissioner M. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Smith moved that the January payroll be approved in the amount of \$36,455.22. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

Irv Rustad, Lake Agassiz Regional Council, discussed the North Dakota Community Development Block Grant Program. This would allow cities and counties to receive financing on projects such as housing, water, sewer, etc. It would have to benefit low to moderate income persons. Any city could write a request and the county would be the sponsor. LARC would do all the work, Sargent County would only sponsor the projects.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the Board approve the sponsorship for any city that qualifies for the North Dakota CDBGP. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

The Board proceeded to review a revised floor plan of the offices located in the Sargent County Courthouse. It was agreed that the Courthouse Commissioner should inform the offices of the changes and request that the move be made as time permits.

Commissioner M. Anderson moved that any office space used by offices other than county related shall pay a rental fee of \$.70 per square foot effective February 1, 1983. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

Lyle Bopp, States Attorney, discussed a State's Attorney Seminar being held in Bismarck on January 19-22. The Board approved lodging. He also stated that he plans to have a separate phone for the States Attorney line. Also, he asked permission to hire his sister, Karen Bopp, as a part-time clerk. Commissioner Smith moved that the Board approve this request for a period of 6 weeks beginning January 17, 1983 through February 28, 1983 at \$327.50/month. Commissioner M. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

George Lewis, Butler Machinery, met with the Board and discussed several options for rental, lease-purchase or cash on motor graders. No decision made at this time.

Ron Narum and Dennis Dockter, Sargent County Weed Board, talked with the Board about coverage under the county insurance policy. The Board informed them that the present company does not write errors and omissions, but they are in the process of applying with a company who does write this type of insurance. They will keep the Weed Board in mind when making said application.

The December Narrative was presented to the Board from Sargent County Community Health Service.

Commissioner Smith moved that 1000 property tags be ordered from Fargo Rubber Stamp Industries to be used to number equipment for inventory purposes. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Curt Freitag, Civil Defense Director, asked permission to store 250# of radiation in the jail for a class to be presented in two weeks. Permission granted.

The second meeting in February will be held on February 22, 1983 due to a conflict with another meeting previously scheduled in Bismarck.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board approve Games of Chance Permit No. 22 to Forman Lions Club for a raffle to be held on February 20, 1983 (alternate date-February 27, 1983) at Buffalo Lake during a fishing derby. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner M. Anderson moved that the Board concur with Harlem Township's decision to approve an application

for abatement and settlement of taxes for Ralph Ender under the Homestead Credit Act. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

Sheriff Barglof presented a proposed plan for visiting and booking rooms adjacent to the jail cell. Said rooms are required under the state jail plan. The Board tabled decision until an inspection report is received from the state.

A discussion was held on the future of Sargent County. It was decided to form a board known as the Sargent County Economic Development Council. Said council will consist of five commissioners and the tax director. Mitch Marcuson, Tax Director, will act as Executive Secretary for this council. The main function of this board will be to encourage commercial activity in Sargent County.

Representatives from NCR Corporation and Don Schiele, Dakota Programs, presented a proposal for NCR Data Processing Hardware/Operating System and North Dakota Tax Expense/Budget/Revenue, Payroll & General Ledger System. The proposal was for a lease/purchase plan over a period of five years. Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that Sargent County sign the Products and Services Terms Record for a NCR-9020, with delivery date on April 1, 1983. Commissioner M. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried unanimously. All information is on file in the office of the County Auditor.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the following bills be approved for payment. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the minutes be approved as corrected. Commissioner M. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner M. Anderson moved that Maynard W. Lien, Milnor, ND be reappointed to the Sargent County Water Resource Board for a term of five years. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that township assessor's shall receive a per diem of \$15.00 and mileage at a rate of 20¢/per mile for attending the training session held at the courthouse. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

An application for abatement and settlement of taxes was approved by the Herman Township Board for Edward and Angeline Skluzak for 1981 under Homestead Credit. Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board comply with the township board and approve said application. Commissioner M. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

A letter from the ND State Highway Dept. requesting reinspection of all major county federal aid structures in 1983 was discussed by the Board. There was no objection and the department will be informed to proceed with the work.

Neil L. Fahlsing, Corrections Specialist, Office of Attorney General, submitted a report to the Board showing all areas of compliance and non-compliance in the Sargent County Jail. The matter was tabled until a further date.

Commissioner M. Anderson moved that the county treasurer be given authority to destroy all unused tax receipts. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried.

Ted and Lois Kiefer met with the Board and discussed different problems relative to their jobs and also their salaries. No decision made.

Bernie Vculek met with the Board about the possibility of testing the road North of Crete for upgrading. The Board informed Mr. Vculek that they would do some checking with the State Highway Department and go out to the site and take a look for themselves.

Orville Nelson asked the Board about right-of-way on County Road #3 near Jenson Slough. The Board agreed to have the States Attorney check into the matter for Mr. Nelson.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board cancel the 1982 taxes on a parcel in the southeast corner of SE 1/4-16-130-55 - 340 x 140 feet. Said property is owned by Rutland Consolidated School and is considered exempt. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.





The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the minutes be approved as corrected. Commissioner M. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner M. Anderson moved that the Board approve the February payroll in the sum of \$36,965.53. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

Applications for Abatement and Settlement of Taxes were received from Marion & Thora Johnson for a non-existing improvement on S. 116.49' of Lots 1-2-3, Blk 10, East Side Addition, Forman City and Bertha Bussman for Homestead Credit on part of Lots 8-9-10 and all of Lot 11, Outlot N, Auditors Plat and All of Lot 12, Outlot N, Auditors Plat, Milnor City. Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that these applications be referred to the respective cities for their consideration. Commissioner M. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

An Order Appointing Magistrate was received from Judge Tjon. Commissioner Smith moved that the appointment of Patricia J. Carlen as magistrate of the County Court of Sargent County, State of North Dakota, is hereby in all respects confirmed and that all duties shall be inclusive of position therein elected, namely Register of Deeds and Clerk of Court. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

A letter was reviewed from the Oakes Public School District. A request was made to place "School Bus Stop Ahead" signs west of the Dale McHarry residence on County Road #2 in Section 20-131-58. The Board acknowledged receipt of this letter and contacted the road foreman to install the signs as soon as possible.

Commissioner M. Anderson moved that the Board transfer to the following funds: \$5,000.00 from County Poor Relief to County Poor and \$15,000.00 from County Poor Relief to Social Welfare. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Smith moved that the Board transfer \$3,000.00 from Federal Revenue Sharing to County Special Highway. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Irv Rustad, Lake Agassiz Regional Council, met with the Board in regards to the North Dakota Community Development Block Grant. The cities of Cayuga, Cogswell, Havana and Rutland have requested Sargent County to sponsor their applications.

Commissioner Manikowski introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, Sargent County received letters of request from Cayuga, Cogswell, Havana and Rutland to apply on behalf of their communities for a CDBG application to the State of North Dakota, and

WHEREAS, there must be a sponsoring agency before these applications can be considered,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that an application be made to the North Dakota Community Development Block Grant on behalf of the communities of Cayuga, Cogswell, Havana and Rutland and that Sargent County sponsor said application.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the resolution and roll call vote, all commissioners voted aye, no one voted nay and the resolution was duly declared carried and adopted.

Several members of the Sargent County Advisory Council met with the commissioners and expressed the importance of continued full support of the county agent's programs. Their duties are to meet with the county agent and provide input in future programs. The Board assured the members that they would continue to support the program as they have done in the past.

Syd Hanson, County Nurse, presented the January narrative and answered questions pertaining to the health program.

Milton Olson, Dickey Rural Telephone Co., met with the Board to discuss the lease which has been drawn up for the tower located on the Sargent County Fairgrounds. The Board will have the States Attorney check over the lease before any action is taken.

The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the minutes be approved as corrected. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

Dave Potter, Tewaukon National Wildlife Refuge, informed the Board that he had presented a check to the County Treasurer for \$29,549.00. This money is the US Fish and Wildlife Service revenue sharing payment on 10,403 acres of land in Sargent County. This averages to \$2.84 per acre including a large acreage of sloughs. Mr. Potter also discussed a slough area in Marboe Township which has been drained. The Board referred him to the Sargent County Water Resource Board.


Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board grant permission to the Sargent County Fair Board to apply to

from the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The Board informed him that there are several projects under the  
Federal Aid System in Sargent County that would have priority over any new road projects that might request  
county funding.

Quentin Hoistad discussed a bridge located in Rutland Township between Sections 34 and 35. The Board  
informed him that the Supervisors of Rutland Township will be meeting this afternoon to discuss the same  
bridge.

Arden Barglof, Sheriff, discussed guns, radar and problems at the fairgrounds. A discussion on the jail  
inspection report determined that a letter be sent to the Corrections Specialist requesting a variance in
