WHEREAS there is now pending before Congress Farm Debt Adjustment Bills S 3509 and H R 8748 that will remedy this situation,

RE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that we respectfully petition Congress to enact this measure at this session to enable our people to get a new start in life and improve the morale and the future prospects of all the people of this county, state and nation.

And that copies of this resolution be sent to the Chairman of the Senate Committee on Banking and Currency, Robert F. Wagner and House Committee on Agriculture, Congressman Marvin Jones, also to Senators B. K. Wheeler, Lynn J. Frazier, Gerald P. Nye and Congressmen William Lemke and Usher L. Burdick.

Commission er Anderson seconded the motion and same carried and the resolution was adopted, all voting aye.

Commissioner Dawson moved that 3 flatcars be purchased to use as material for piling and bridge repair. Commissioner Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

On motion each Commissioner was authorized to lease County tax deed lands within his district, subject to the approval by the County Board as a whole.

On motion each Commissioner was authorized to sign AAA applications for soil conservation and parity payment on County lands within their respective districts.

On motion it was decided to inspect new and used highway equipment submitted in proposals for furnishing of highway equipment on March 8th, at Fargo and other points on March 16th, with a view to awarding contracts for same.

On motion the Board allowed the application of Viola Ayers Lehr for an abatement of school poll tax in Village of Cogswell, for the year 1934, in the amount of \$1.00, for the reason that applicant was not a resident of Sargent County at that time.

On motion the Board adjourned at 6 o'clock, p. m., to 9 o'clock, a. m., March 25th, 1940.

Purchase price for the Diesel Tractor to be \$4,857.00 with an allowance of \$957.00 for the tradein of the Sargent County 60 HP gas caterpillar tractor, or \$3,900.00 for the Diesel tractor and \$2,400.00 for the scraper, all equipment F. O. B. Sargent County, and the Chairman of the Board and County Auditor were authorized and directed to execute said lease agreements.

Several delegations conferred with the Board during the day in regard to highway, taxes and WPA.
