WHEREAS THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, BEING OPPOSED TO THE CENTRALIZATION OF AUTHORITY, FEELS THAT IF THE SERVICES OF NURSES WILL CONTINUE TO BE AVAILABLE, THAT THE COUNTY WILL BE ABLE TO EMPLOY ONE TO BETTER ADVANTAGE BY REMAINING AN INDEPENDENT UNIT AS IN THE PAST,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT WE DECLINE TO JOIN IN THE FORMATION OF A HEALTH DISTRICT AS OUT-LINED BY CHAPTER 220, 1943 SESSION LAWS.
