THE QUARTERLY REPORT OF JUSTICE OF THE PEACE J. E. ELLSWORTH, FOR THE QUARTER ENDING JUNE 30, 1944, HAVING BEEN APPROVED BY THE STATE'S ATTORNEY AS TO FORM, WAS ON MOTION APPROVED BY THE BOARD.

The quarterly report of Justice of the Peace, J. H. Hohaus, for the quarter ending June 30th, 1944, having been approved by the State's Attorney as to form, was on motion approved by the Board and Justice fees in same allowed and ordered paid in the amount of \$4.95.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS CONVENED, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT

On motion the Board adjourned as Board of County Commissioners to 9 o'clock, a. m., July 12th, 1944, and proceeded to organize as Board of Review and Equalization.

On MOTION COMMISSIONER RONNING WAS DESIGNATED CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF REVIEW AND EQUALIZATION

On motion R. W. Safstrom, County Auditor, was appointed clerk and Secretary of the Board of Review and Equalization.

The oath of office was administered to the members of the Board in due form and on motion the Board proceeded to review and equalize the assessment as returned by the assessors of the various districts of the County for the year 1944.

On motion the Board examined the assessors books of assessment of farm lands and village lots, INCLUDING STRUCTURES ON VILLAGE LOTS AND FOUND THAT THE ASSESSORS HAD COMPLIED WITH CHAPTER 228, SECTION 2093 OF THE SESSION LAWS OF 1917, WHICH CHAPTER PROVIDES THAT REAL ESTATE, INCLUDING STRUCTURES, BE ASSESSED FOR THE EVEN NUMBERED YEARS AT THE SAME VALUE AS LEFT BY THE STATE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION FOR THE PRECEDING YEAR.

THE BOARD FOUND THAT SAID LAW HAD BEEN FULLY COMPLIED WITH; THAT NO ASSESSMENT HAD BEEN MADE EXCEPT SOME CHANGES MADE NECESSARY FOR THE REASON THAT IN SOME CASES STRUCTURES HAD EITHER BEEN ERECT-ED OR REMOVED OR DESTROYED SINCE THE LAST ASSESSMENT WAS MADE, AND IN SOME CASES PROPERTY WHICH HAD PREVI-OUSLY BEEN OMITTED FROM TAXATION HAD BEEN ADDED.
