THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

COMMISSIONER DAWSON MOVED THAT KEITH STALTER BE APPOINTED PUBLIC ADMINISTRATOR FOR A TERM BEGINNING APRIL 1, 1947 AND ENDING APRIL 1, 1948.  
COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT A CERTAIN TRUST MORTGAGE ON LOTS 6 & 7, BLOCK 34, CITY OF MILNOR, EXECUTED BY IDA LONG, BE ORDERED SATISFIED AT THE REQUEST OF THE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD OF NORTH DAKOTA AND THAT THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD AND AUDITOR BE DIRECTED TO SIGN SUCH SATISFACTION.  
COMMISSIONER NELSON SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER DAWSON INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SARGENT COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY OF SARGENT NORTH DAKOTA, THAT THE HEALTH DISTRICT PLAN AS PROVIDED FOR BY CHAPTER 23-14, SECTION 1401, 1943 REVISED CODE, ENACTED BY THE TWENTY-EIGHTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, AND AS PROPOSED BY THE STATE HEALTH OFFICER, BE IN ALL THINGS ADOPTED.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THE DATE OF THE ACTUAL TRANSITION FROM THE PLAN NOW IN FORCE TO THE HEALTH DISTRICT PLAN HEREIN ADOPTED, SHALL AWAIT THE COMPLETION OF THE PLAN IN THE COUNTY, AND AS OF A DATE TO BE DETERMINED BY THE STATE HEALTH OFFICER.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

A PETITION SIGNED BY ELECTORS OF TAYLOR TOWNSHIP, REQUESTING THAT THE BRAMPTON-TAYLOR DRAINAGE DITCH No. 9, BE DREDGED AND CLEANED SO THAT THE WATER WILL GO THROUGH FREELY, WAS PRESENTED TO THE BOARD.  
COMMISSIONER DAWSON MOVED THAT THE PETITION BE ALLOWED. COMMISSIONER NELSON SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

ON MOTION THE BOARD APPROVED THE REPORT OF SHERIFF A. B. CHRISTIANSEN, OF DELINQUENT PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES COLLECTED DURING THE MONTH OF MARCH IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,037.37.

A PETITION SIGNED BY VOTERS OF WILLEY TOWNSHIP, REQUESTING THAT THE COUNTY COMPLETE AT THE EARLIEST POSSIBLE TIME AN UNCOMPLETED SECTION OF COUNTY HIGHWAY IN SAID TOWNSHIP AND FOUR MILES OF STREAM LINING.

NO ACTION WAS TAKEN AT THIS TIME.

ON MOTION THE BOARD APPROVED THE CORONER'S ACCOUNT OF DR. F. G. HUBBARD IN THE MATTER OF THE INQUISITION UPON THE BODY OF SYLVESTER WOLF, DECEASED, HELD MARCH 24 AND FEES AND MILEAGE IN SAME ALLOWED.

ON MOTION THE BOARD APPROVED AN AMENDED CORONER'S ACCOUNT OF DR. F. G. HUBBARD IN THE MATTER OF AN INQUISITION UPON THE DEAD BODIES OF ANTHONY, VERNON AND JUDITH ANN SCHUMAN AND KATHERINE TABER HELD DECEMBER 12, 13, 1946 AND JANUARY 27, 28, 1947 AND FEES AND MILEAGE IN SAME ALLOWED.

COMMISSIONER DAWSON MOVED THAT THE COUNTY AUDITOR BE AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO PAY BY AUDITORS WARRANTS ALL BILLS FOR LIGHT AND POWER OWED BY THE COUNTY WHEN PRESENTED THROUGH REGULAR CHANNELS.  
COMMISSIONER NELSON SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE OFFICIAL OATH OF OFFICE WAS ADMINISTERED TO R. W. SAFSTROM AS COUNTY AUDITOR, FOR THE ENSUING TWO YEARS, AND HIS BOND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$10,000.00 WITH THE STATE BONDING FUND AS SURETY, WAS ON MOTION APPROVED BY THE BOARD.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET, AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE, IN SPECIAL SESSION, PURSUANT TO CALL BY THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT EXCEPT COMMISSIONER DAWSON.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO CONSIDER WHAT ACTION COULD BE TAKEN TO OBTAIN THE CONSENT OF THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT TO RETAIN STATE HIGHWAY NO. 13 AS PART OF THE STATE HIGHWAY SYSTEM IN ITS PRESENT LOCATION AND TO HAVE NECESSARY REPAIRS MADE THIS YEAR.

COMMISSIONER MEINHARDT INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

"WHEREAS THE PRESENT LOCATION OF STATE HIGHWAY NO. 13 IN SARGENT COUNTY IS THE MOST LOGICAL, INASMUCH AS IT SERVES THE TOWN AND COMMUNITIES OF MILNOR, GWINNER, DELAMERE, STIRUM, CRETE AND OAKES, MAKING A DIRECT ROUTE BETWEEN WAHPETON AND OAKES, IN ADDITION TO THE REGULAR THROUGH TRAFFIC, AND

WHEREAS AT MASS MEETINGS HELD AT MILNOR, APRIL 8TH AND AT GWINNER APRIL 18TH, WHICH MEETINGS WERE ATTENDED BY DELEGATIONS FROM WAHPETON, DELAMERE, MILNOR, GWINNER, STIRUM, CRETE, OAKES AND WYNDMERE, RESOLUTIONS WERE PASSED REQUESTING THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT TO "HARD SURFACE" STATE HIGHWAY NO. 13 FROM WYNDMERE TO ITS JUNCTION WITH STATE HIGHWAY NO. 1, IN ITS PRESENT LOCATION, AND COMMITTEES FROM THE ABOVE MENTIONED TOWNS WERE APPOINTED TO MEET AS ONE DELEGATION WITH THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT AT BISMARCK, N. D. APRIL 24, 1947,

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY THAT THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT BE REQUESTED TO GIVE DUE CONSIDERATION TO THE SUGGESTIONS OF THE DELEGATION WHICH IS TO MEET WITH THE DEPARTMENT APRIL 24TH, AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT WE RESPECTFULLY REQUEST THAT STATE HIGHWAY NO. 13 BE LEFT IN ITS PRESENT LOCATION AND THAT THE DEPARTMENT PROCEED TO IMPROVE SAID STATE HIGHWAY NO. 13 FROM WYNDMERE TO ITS JUNCTION WITH STATE HIGHWAY NO. 1, NORTH OF OAKES AT AN EARLY DATE."

COMMISSIONER NELSON SECONDED THE MOTION AND CARRIED.

ON MOTION C. F. COLE WAS NAMED CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD AND R. W. SAFSTROM, SECRETARY.

2ND DISTRICT TO EMBRACE RANSOM, KINGSTON, WEBER, TEWAUKON AND MARBOE TOWNSHIPS AND HAVANA AND CAVUGA VILLAGES.

3RD DISTRICT TO BE COMPRISED OF BOWEN, DUNBAR, FORMAN AND RUTLAND TOWNSHIPS AND TOWN OF FORMAN.

4TH DISTRICT TO CONSIST OF JACKSON, SARGENT, SOUTH WEST, BRAMPTON AND TAYLOR TOWNSHIPS AND VILLAGE OF COGSWELL.

5TH DISTRICT TO CONSIST OF HARLEM, VERNER, DENVER, VIVIAN AND WHITE STONE HILL TOWNSHIPS AND VILLAGE OF GWINNER.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO CHECK THE PETITIONS FILED AND FOUND THAT THERE WERE 610 SIGNERS.



M., JUNE 23, 1947.
