PERFORMANCE BOND OF WHEELER LUMBER BRIDGE & SUPPLY COMPANY, IN THE SUM OF \$1,000.00 WITH SEABOARD SURETY COMPANY AS SURETY, GIVEN IN CONNECTION WITH SAID COMPANY S CONTRACT TO FURNISH BRIDGE LUMBER MATERIAL FOR THE County for the ensuing year, and having been approved as to form by the State's Attorney.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT REESE BARTLETT BE APPOINTED DIRECTOR OF GARRISON DIVERSION CONSERVANCY DISTRICT FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1. 1958 TO JUNE 30. 1961.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER SMITH MOVED THAT THE COUNTY ENTER INTO THE FOLLOWING AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT:

THE COUNTY OF SARGENT, STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE COUNTY, AND THE NORTH DAKOTA STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE DEPARTMENT, AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. THE DEPARTMENT WILL TAKE ALL STEPS NECESSARY TOWARD SECURING COOPERATION WITH THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT IN ORDER TO OBTAIN FEDERAL FUNDS TO THE EXTENT PROVIDED IN THE FEDERAL-AID HIGHWAY ACT OF 1944, OR OTHER SUBSEQUENT FEDERAL-AID HIGHWAY ACTS, WHICH AUTHORIZE APPROPRIATIONS FOR CONTINUING THE CONSTRUCTION OF HIGHWAYS ON THE COUNTY FEDERAL-AID SECONDARY SYSTEM, FOR THE FOLLOWING DESCRIBED FEDERAL-AID SECONDARY PRO-JECT No. S 217(3) GRADING ON A COUNTY ROAD FROM CAYUGA SOUTHERLY.
- 2. THE COUNTY WILL PAY ALL CONSTRUCTION COSTS EXCEPT THE AMOUNT PAID BY THE UNITED STATES GOVERN-MENT THROUGH THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS AND, IF THE DEPARTMENT ADVANCES ANY PAYMENT IN BEHALF OF THE COUNTY

TO THE CONTRACTOR OR ANY OTHER PARTIES WHICH ARE LATER FOUND NON COLLECTABLE FROM THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS, THE COUNTY WILL REIMBURSE THE DEPARTMENT FOR FUNDS SO ADVANCED. THE TERM "CONSTRUCTION" MEANS THE SUPERVISING, INSPECTING, ACTUAL BUILDING AND ALL EXPENSES INCIDENTAL TO THE CONSTRUCTION OR RECONSTRUCTION OF THE HIGHWAY INCLUDING LOCATING, SURVEYING, MAPPING, COSTS OF RIGHTS-OF-WAY, COSTS OF ADVERTISING AND THE COST OF ALL OTHER WORK NECESSARY TO COMPLETE THE PROJECT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS.

- 3. THE COUNTY AGREES TO MAKE BINDING AND A PART OF THIS AGREEMENT ALL PROVISION OF RESOLUTIONS EXECUTED BY THE COUNTY AFFECTING THIS PROJECT OR RELATING TO THE MAINTENANCE OF ANY PORTION OF THE COUNTY SEPRENCE FEDERAL-AID SECONDARY SYSTEM.
- 4. THE COUNTY WILL, AT ITS EXPENSE AND WITHOUT FEDERAL-AID REIMBURSEMENT, ACQUIRE THE NECESSARY RIGHTS-OF-WAY.
- 5. ADEQUATE ENGINEERING, SUPERVISION AND INSPECTION SHALL BE PROVIDED BY THE COUNTY UNDER THE GENERAL DIRECTION AND CONTROL OF THE DEPARTMENT, AND THE COUNTY SHALL MAKE SUCH REPORTS, KEEP SUCH RECORDS AND PERFORM SUCH WORK IN THE MANNER AND TIME AS THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REQUEST AND DIRECT SO AS TO ENABLE THE DEPARTMENT, AS THE AGENT OF THE COUNTY, TO COLLECT FOR THE COUNTY THE FEDERAL-AID EARNED.
- 6. REQUIRED TESTS OF ALL MATERIALS ENTERING INTO THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE PROJECT SHALL BE MADE BY OR UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT TESTING LABORATORY. IT IS THE COUNTY'S RESPONSIBILITY TO SEE THAT THE REQUIRED NUMBER OF SAMPLES ARE TAKEN IN A SATISFACTORY MANNER AND PROPERLY SUBMITTED FOR TESTING.
- 7. FEDERAL FUNDS WILL ONLY PARTICIPATE IN WORK PERFORMED SUBSEQUENT TO AUTHORIZATION BY THE DISTRICT ENGINEER OF THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS AND THE DEPARTMENT.
- 8. An engineering and clerical charge of 1% of the total cost of the project will be made by the State Highway Department which the County agrees to pay upon completion of the project.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD AND COUNTY AUDITOR ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO SIGN THIS AGREEMENT. COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE BOARD ENTER INTO THE FOLLOWING AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT:

THE COUNTY OF SARGENT, STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE COUNTY, AND THE NORTH DAKOTA STATE HISHWAY DEPARTMENT, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That the Highway Department will submit a project for the improvement of 9.690 miles of the County Federal—aid Secondary Highway, Grading on a County road from Cayuga Southerly and to be designated as North Dakota Project No. S 217(3), and will recommend its approval by the Bureau of Public Roads of the Department of Commerce of the united States of America for Construction with funds apportioned to the State under the Federal Highway Act as amended and supplemented; subject, however, to the Condition that the County shall provide for its proper maintenance after Completion of its improvement.
- 2. THAT THE SAID COUNTY HERBY REQUESTS THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT TO SUBMIT THE AFOREMENTIONED PROJECT WITH RECOMMENDATION THAT IT BE APPROVED BY THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, AND AGREES THAT IF SUCH PROJECT IS APPROVED AND CONSTRUCTED BY THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT AND THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, IT THEREAFTER, AT ITS OWN COST AND EXPENSE, WILL MAINTAIN THE PROJECT IN A MANNER SATISFACTORY TO THEM, OR THEIR AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES, AND WILL MAKE AMPLE PROVISION EACH YEAR FOR SUCH MAINTENANCE.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD AND COUNTY AUDITOR ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO SIGN THE ABOVE MAIN-TENANCE AGREEMENT.

COMMISSIONER SMITH SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

Commissioner Hoflen moved that the Chairman of the Board be authorized to certify to the State Highway Department that all necessary reights of way for FAS Project No. S 217(3) have been acquired.

Commissioner Walstead seconded the motion, and same Carried.

Commissioner Walstead moved that the date of hearing on the above petition be set at 3 ofclock, p. m., July 8, 1958 in the Commissioners room.

COMMISSIONER MARQUETTE SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

Commissioner Smith offered the following resolution, And, seconded by Commissioner Hoflen, moved its

ADOPTION:

WHEREAS, THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT CONTEMPLATES THE IMPROVEMENT OR CONSTRUCTION OF A PART OF ITS HIGHWAY SYSTEM WITHIN THIS COUNTY IN CONNECTION WITH WHAT IS KNOWN AS HIGHWAY PROJECT NO. S 430(3), LOCATION - GWINNER WEST AND SUCH IMPROVEMENT OR CONSTRUCTION WILL REQUIRE THE ACQUISITION BY THE STATE OF LANDS FOR RIGHT OF WAY WITHIN THE COUNTY.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, THAT THIS COUNTY PAY FIFTY PERCENT (50%) OF THE ACTUAL COST OF SUCH LANDS, WHETHER ACQUIRED BY CONDEMNATION PROCEEDINGS OR BY DIRECT PURCHASES FROM THE OWNERS OF THE SAME, INCLUDING SUCH SUMS AS MAY BE PAID AND ALLOWED SUCH OWNERS ON ACCOUNT OF DAMAGES TO IMPROVEMENTS, REMOVAL OF IMPROVEMENTS OR OTHER ALLOWABLE DAMAGES UNDER THE LAW OF EMINENT DOMAIN OF THIS STATE, INCLUDING LANDS ACQUIRED BY PURCHASE AT WHAT IS DEEMED A REASONABLE VALUATION BY THE STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT IF SAID LANDS TO BE ACQUIRED FOR HIGHWAY PURPOSES ARE ACQUIRED BY THIS COUNTY OR ITS BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR AND IN BEHALF OF THE STATE, AND PAID FOR WITH COUNTY FUNDS, AFTER SUCH PAYMENTS ARE MADE, AND AS SOON AS IT IS CONVENIENT THE COUNTY AUDITOR SHALL PRESENT TO THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, PROPER VOUCHER FOR REIMBURSEMENT TO THIS COUNTY OF FIFTY PERCENT (50%) OF THE COUNTY FUNDS SO EXPENDED THEREFOR; AND, IF SAID LANDS OR ANY OF THEM ARE ACQUIRED AND PAID FOR BY THE STATE, OR ITS STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT OUT OF STATE FUNDS, THEN THE COUNTY AUDITOR UPON PRESENTATION TO HIM OF A VOUCHER DULY CERTIFIED BY THE RIGHT OF WAY ENGINEER OF SAID STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, SHALL, AND HE IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO DRAW AND DELIVER TO THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT DUE AND PROPER COUNTY WARRANT OF THIS COUNTY FOR FIFTY PERCENT (50%) OF THE ACTUAL TOTAL COST OF SAID LANDS SO PAID FOR BY THE STATE OR ITS STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT IF SAID LANDS ARE ACQUIRED BY THIS COUNTY OR ITS BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISS-IONERS, NO COMMITMENTS OR PROMISES, OTHER THAN A CASH CONSIDERATION, WILL BE MADE TO THE PROPERTY OWNER UNLESS PRIOR APPROVAL IN WRITING IS RECEIVED FROM THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.

ON ROLL CALL ALL MEMBERS PRESENT VOTED IN FAVOR OF SAID RESOLUTION, AND THE SAME WAS DECLARED DULY CARRIED AND ADDPTED.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS, THE BID IN THE AMOUNT OF \$40,197.23 OF TOM W. ABRAHAM RECEIVED IN THE LETTING OF MAY 23, 1958, FOR PROJECT S 217(3) WAS THE LOW BID RECEIVED, AND

WHEREAS, THIS BID IS CONSIDERED REASONABLE AND IS UNDER THE ENGINEER'S ESTIMATE,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY THAT THE HIGHWAY

DEPARTMENT BE REQUESTED TO AWARD TO THE TOM W. ABRAHAM THE CONTRACT FOR PROJECT S 217(3) (CAYUGA SOUTH) AND SECURE
FEDERAL CONCURRENCE THEREOF.

IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD THAT THE COUNTY SHALL REIMBURSE THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT FOR ANY PAYMENTS MADE UNDER THIS CONTRACT, WHICH ARE NOT COLLECTIBLE FROM THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING PESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS CERTAIN COUNTY HIGHWAYS ARE IN NEED OF RECONSTRUCTION AND SHOULD BE INCLUDED IN THE COUNTY FEDERAL AID SECONDARY ROAD SYSTEM BUT APPROVAL OF SUCH INCLUSION HAS NOT BEEN POSSIBLE IN THE PAST, DUE TO THE FACT THAT THESE GHIGWAYS INTERSECT THE SOUTH DAKOTA STATE LINE, AND CONNECTING ROADS IN SOUTH DAKOTA HAVE NOT UP TO NOW BEEN INCLUDED IN THE FEDERAL AID SECONDARY ROAD SYSTEM AND,

WHEREAS MARSHALL COUNTY, STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA, NOW HAS MADE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL AID TO RECONSTRUCT

THESE HIGHWAYS,
