IN THE SUM OF \$1,000.00 WITH SEABOARD SURETY CO. AS SURETY, GIVEN INCONNECTION WITH SAID COMPANY'S CONTRACT TO FURNISH BRIDGE AND LUMBER MATERIALS FOR THE YEAR 1961; BOTH BONDS HAVING BEEN APPROVED BY THE STATE'S ATTORNEY AS TO FORM, BE APPROVED BY THE BOARD.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE COUNTY OF SARGENT, STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE COUNTY, AND THE NORTH DAKOTA
STATE HIGHWAY BEPARTMENT, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE DEPARTMENT, AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. THE DEPARTMENT WILL TAKE ALL STEPS NECESSARY TOWARD SECURING CO-OPERATION WITH THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT IN ORDER TO OBTAIN FEDERAL FUNDS TO THE EXTENT PROVIDED IN TITLE 23 OF THE United States Code as amended and supplemented and authorizations provided pursuant thereto and available for the following described Federal-aid Secondary Project Nos. CS 767(3) and CS 838(5), on County Road from State Highway 13, SE of Delamere South and East.

2. THE COUNTY WILL PAY ALL CONSTRUCTION COSTS EXCEPT THE AMOUNT (NOT TO EXCEED 50 %) PAID BY THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT THROUGH THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS, AND, IF THE DEPARTMENT ADVANCES ANY PAYMENT IN BEHALF OF THE COUNTY WHICH AR LATER FOUND NON-COLLECTIBLE FROM THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS, THE COUNTY WILL REIMBURSE THE DEPARTMENT FOR FUNDS SO ADVANCED. THE TERM"CONSTRUCTION COSTS# SHALL MEAN THOSE EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE ACTUAL BUILDING AND ALL EXPENSES INCIDENTAL TO THE CONSTRUCTION SUCH AS PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING, COST OF ADVERTISING, COSTS FOR FIELD AND LABORATORY TESTS AND RECORD TESTING, COST FOR PRINTING OF PLANS AND THE COST OF ALL OTHER WORK NECESSARY TO COMPLETE THE PROJECT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE APPROVED PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS.

3. THE COUNTY AGREES TO KEEP RECORDS AND FURNISH COPIES THEROF OR KEEP OPEN TO THE DEPARTMENT AND THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS ALL RECORDS AND FILES PERTAINING TO THE PROJECT SO AS TO ENABLE THE DEPARTMENT TO OSTAIN IN BEHALF OF THE COUNTY FEDERAL PARTICIPATION.

4. THE COUNTY WILL, AT ITS OWN EXPENSE AND WITHOUT FEDERAL REIMBURSEMENT, ACQUIRE THE NECESSARY RIGHT-OF-

5. ADEQUATE ENGINEERING, SUPERVISION AND INSPECTION SHALL BE PROVIDED BY THE COUNTY UNDER THE GENERAL DIRECTION AND CONTROL OF THE DEPARTMENT, AND THE COUNTY SHALL MAKE SUCH REPORTS, KEEP SUCH RECORDS AND PERFORM SUCH WORK
IN THE MANNER AND TIME AS THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REQUEST AND DIRECT SO AS TO ENABLE THE DEPARTMENT, AS THE AGENT OF THE
COUNTY TO COLECT FOR THE COUNTY THE FEDERAL-AID EARNED.

6. It is agreed that the County shall have sole responsibility to see that the required number of samples are taken in a satisfactory manner and properly submitted for testing by or under the supervision of the department's testing laboratory at Bismarck, North Dakota of all materials to be incorporated into the construction of the project and subsimilarly for those tests of the completed project (s) as required at the discretion of the Bureau of Public Roads or its authorized representatives and the department.

7. FEDERAL FUNDS WILL ONLY PARTICIATE IN WORK PERFORMED SUBSEQUENT TO AUTHORIZATION BY THE DISTRICT ENGINEER OF THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS AND THE DEFARTMENT.

8. An engineering and clerical charge of 1 % of the total cost of the project will be made by the State Highway Department which the County agrees to pay upon completion of the project(s).

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD AND THE COUNTY AUDITOR ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO SIGN THIS AGREEMENT. COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER ENGE MOVED THAT THE COUNTY ENTER INTO THE FOLLOWING MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE HIGH-

THE COUNTY OF SARGENT, STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE COUNTY, AND THE MORTH DAKOTA STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, HEREBY AGRRES AS FOLLOWS:

1. THAT THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT WILL SUBMIT A PROJECT FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF 1.284 AND 6.010 MILES OF THE COUNTY FEDERAL—AID SECONDARY HIGHWAY — GRADE ON A COUNTY ROAD FROM S.H. 13 SE OF DELEMERE SOUTH AND FAST AND TO BE DESIGNATED AS NORTH DAKOTA PROJECT NOS. CS 838(5) AND 767(3), AND WILL RECOMMEND ITS APPROVAL BY THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA FOR THE CONSTRUCTION WITH FUNDS APPORTIONED TO THE STATE UNDER THE FEDERAL HIGHWAY ACT AS AMENDED AND SUPPLEMENTED; SUBJECT, HOWEVER, TO THE CONDITION THAT THE COUNTY SHALL PROVIDE FOR ITS PROPER MAINTENANCE AFTER COMPLETION OF ITS IMPROVEMENT.

2. THAT THE SAID COUNTY HEREBY REQUEST THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT TO SUBMIT THE AFGREMENTICNED PROJECTS WITH RECOMMENDATION THAT IT BE APPROVED BY THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, AND AGREES THATIF SUCH PROJECT IS APPROVED AND CONSTRUCTED BY THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT AND THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, IT THEREAFTER, AT ITS OWN COST AND EXPENSE, WILL MAINTAIN THE PROJECT IN A MANNER SATISFACTORY TO THEM, OR THEIR AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES, AND WILL MAKE AMPLE PROVISIONS EACH YEAR FOR SUCH MAINTENANCE.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER ENGE MOVED THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE BID OF THE FORMAN IMPLEMENT CO. FOR THE PURCHASE OF ONE INTERNATIONAL (Madel 240) TRACTOR AND MOWER WITH SIX FOOT BAR COMPLETE FOR THE SUM OF \$3,107.68.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE BID OF THE FORMAN IMPLEMENT CO. FOR THE SALE OF ONE TRACTOR COMPLETE WITH MOWER FOR THE SUM OF \$1,107.68 VAC CASE

COMMISSIONER ENGE SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHERAS; THE BRIDGE LOCATED BETWEEN SECTIONS 12 AND 13, TOWNSHIP 129, RANGE 56, ON COUNTY HIGHWAY E, IS PART OF THE WILD RICE CREEK WATER SHED CHANNEL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM.

WHERAS: THE PRESENT BRIDGE IS NOT SUFFICIENT TO MEET THE SPECIFIATIONS NECESSARY FOR THIS CHANNEL IMPROVEMENT AND THAT WORK WILL BE STARTED ON THIS PROJECT ABOUT AUGUST 15TH, 1961.

NOW BE IT RESOLVED: THAT DUE TO THE STARTING DATE OF THE ABOVE NAMED PROJECT, THAT AN EMERGENCY EXITS AND THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROCEED ACCORDING CHAPTER 2408-03 OF THE NORTH DAKOTA CENTURY CODE, AND PURCHASE THE MATERIAL NECESSARY TO REBUILD THE ABOVE NAMED BRIDGE AND NEGOTIATE FOR THE LABOR AND MACHINE HIRE NECESSARY ON AN HOURLY BASIS, WITHOUT CALLING FOR BIDS.

COMMISSIONER ENGE SECONDED THE RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION.

ON ROLL CALL VOTE THE FOLLOWING VOTE WAS HAD. COMMISSIONERS ENGE, HOFLEN AND SMITH VOTED "AYE", COMMISSIONERS COLEMAN AND WALSTEAD MOTED MNAYM. THE MOTE BEING THREE "AYES" AND TWO "NAYS" THE RESOLUTION WAS DULY DECLARED CARRIED AND ADOPTED.

COMMISSIONER ENGE MOVED THAT THE HERREID CONSTRUCTION CO. OF SUMMIT, S. DAK. BE HIRED TO FURNISH THE MACHINE HIPE AND LABOR NECESSARY TO BUILD THE BRIDGE MENTIONED IN THE FOREGOING MINUTES.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION.

On roll call vote the following vote was had, Commissioners Enge, Hoflen and Smith voted "AYE", Commissioners Coleman and Walstead voted "NAY", the vote being three "AYES" and two "NAYS" the motion was declared carried.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN MOVED THAT THE BOARD ADJOURN TO 9 O'CLOCK, A.M. AUGUST 18T, 1961 COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.
