WHEREAS SARGENT COUNTY HAS LEVIED THE MAXIMUM LIMIT OF TAXES ALLOWED BY LAW AND DUE TO THE LOW VALUATION OF THE COUNTY SUCH TAXES ARE INSUFFICIENT TO MEET ORDINARY EXPENDITURES AND THE COUNTY IS WITHOUT FUNDS TO REPAIR DAMAGES TO BRIDGES AND HIGHWAYS TO THE EXTENT OF \$60,000.00, CAUSED BY LAST SPRINGS FLOOD WATERS, IT IS THE OPINION OF THE BOARD THAT SARGENT COUNTY IS AT THIS TIME UNABLE TO ASSUME THIS ADDITIONAL EXPENDITURE.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT STATE AND FEDERAL AUTHORITIES BE REQUESTED TO INCREASE THEIR RESPECTIVE ALLOTMENTS TO THE EXTENT THAT SARGENT COUNTY BE NOT REQUIRED TO PAY MORE THAN ITS PROPORTIONATE SHARE OF THE INCREASE!
