THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING WERE READ AND ON MOTION APPROVED BY THE BOARD AS READ.

ADELBERT DIETZ, CHAIRMAN OF THE JACKSON TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, STANLEY WALETZKO, HAROLD MALLBERG, CHAIRMAN OF THE SARGENT TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, L. W. KUMMETH AND OTHERS MET WITH THE BOARD IN REGARD TO PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT OF COUNTY HIGHWAY K AND FILED PETITIONS SIGNED BY CITIZENS AND TAXPAYERS OF SARGENT COUNTY, REQUESTING THE COUNTY BOARD TO REPAIR AND MAINTAIN HIGHWAY K IN ITS PRESENT LOCATION.

ATTACHED TO THE LETTER WAS AN OPINION FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, DATED JULY 10TH, 1945, INTERPRETING THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 157 OF THE 1945 SESSION LAWS AND STATING THE AMOUNT OF MILEAGE AND SUBSISTENCE THAT THE COMMISSIONERS CAN CHARGE WHILE ATTENDING MEETINGS OF THE BOARD.

THE BOARDS OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF RANSOM, RICHLAND AND SARGENT COUNTIES MET IN JOINT SESSION IN THE COMMISSIONERS ROOM IN THE COURTHOUSE IN FORMAN, N. DAK., AT 2 O'CLOCK, P. M., WITH A MAJORITY OF EACH BOARD PRESENT. ALSO PRESENT WERE STATE'S ATTORNEYS CHAS. EGO OF RANSOM, VERNON D. FORBES OF RICHLAND AND WALTER C. KING OF SARGENT COUNTIES.

THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY OLIVER A. RONNING, CHAIRMAN OF THE SARGENT COUNTY BOARD WHO CALLED FOR NOMINATIONS FOR CHAIRMAN AND SECRETARY FOR THE JOINT SESSION.

AT THE INVITATION OF MR. GUNNESS, MR. VERNON M. JOHNSON, ATTORNEY OF WAHPETON, TOOK THE FLOOR. MR. JOHNSON STATED THAT HE REPRESENTED THE HOLDERS OF WARRANTS AGAINST THIS DRAINAGE DISTRICT AGGREGATING IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$6,625.97, DRAWING INTEREST AT THE RATE OF 7% PER ANNUM, WHICH COMPUTED UP TO THE PRESENT TIME WOULD AMOUNT TO OVER \$15,000.00. HE STATED, HOWEVER, THAT IF A SETTLEMENT COULD BE MADE WITHOUT LITIGATION, THE WARRANT HOLDERS WOULD ACCEPT THE ORIGINAL AMOUNT OF THE WARRANTS AS SETTLEMENT IN FULL OF THEIR CLAIMS.

MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE BOARDS OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF RANSOM, RICHLAND AND SARGENT COUNTIES.

FORMAN, N. DAK. NOVEMBER 10, 1945.

THE BOARDS OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF RANSOM, RICHLAND AND SARGENT COUNTIES MET IN JOINT SESSION, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, IN THE COMMISSIONERS ROOM IN THE COURTHOUSE AT FORMAN, N. DAK. AT 2 O'CLOCK, P. M., WITH ALL MEMBERS OF EACH BOARD PRESENT. STATE'S ATTORNEY CHAS. EGO OF RANSOM, VERNON D. FORBES OF RICHLAND AND WALTER C. KING OF SARGENT COUNTIES, WERE ALSO PRESENT.

ARTHUR S. GUNNESS PRESIDED IN THE CHAIR AND R. W. SAFSTROM ACTED AS SECRETARY.

THE MINUTES OF THE JOINT MEETING HELD OCTOBER 18TH, 1945, WERE READ AND ON MOTION APPROVED AS READ.

THE PURPOSE OF THE MEETING WAS TO CONTINUE DISCUSSION OF MATTERS PERTAINING TO THE RETIREMENT OF OUTSTANDING WARRANTS AGAINST TRI-COUNTY DRAIN, AND OTHER INDEBTEDNESS.

CHAIRMAN GUNNESS CALLED ON STATE'S ATTORNEY EGO OF RANSOM COUNTY. MR. EGO STATED THAT FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS RANSOM COUNTY HAD NOT HAD A DRAINAGE BOARD AND THAT THE LAST MEETING OF THEIR BOARD WAS HELD IN 1907. NO RECORDS WERE AVAILABLE AND HE WAS UNABLE TO DETERMINE WHAT AMOUNT HIS COUNTY MIGHT BE OWING AS THEIR SHARE OF THE COST OF CONSTRUCTING THE TRI-COUNTY DRAIN. HE WAS OF THE OPINION THAT THE MOST IMPORTANT THING WAS TO GET A REPORT OF THE ACTUAL COST OF THE DRAIN AND AN AUDIT OF THE OUTSTANDING WARRANTS AND THAT IT MIGHT REQUIRE LEGISLATIVE ACTION TO ENABLE COUNTY BOARDS TO PAY THE SAME.

THE RECORDS OF THE DRAINAGE BOARD OF SARGENT COUNTY WERE EXAMINED AND IT WAS FOUND THAT ON SEPTEMBER 7TH, 1920, THE DRAINAGE BOARDS OF RICHLAND AND SARGENT COUNTIES MET WITH THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF RANSOM COUNTY AND AT THAT TIME A JOINT COMMITTEE REPRESENTING THE THREE COUNTIES WAS APPOINTED TO MEET FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING AN APPORTIONMENT OF THE COST OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE TRI-COUNTY DRAIN IN ORDER TO MAKE FINAL SETTLEMENT WITH RICHLAND COUNTY.

THE RECORDS FURTHER SHOWS THAT THIS COMMITTEE MET ON SEPTEMBER 9TH, 1920 AND AGREED UPON A DISTRIBUTION OF THE COST OF THE DRAIN, BETWEEN THE THREE COUNTIES, AND THAT ON SEPTEMBER 29TH, 1920, THE RICHLAND COUNTY DRAINAGE BOARD MET WITH SARGENT COUNTY DRAINAGE BOARD AND A FINAL SETTLEMENT WAS EFFECTED AND WARRANTS IN THE SUM OF \$3,949.00 WERE ISSUED BY THE SARGENT COUNTY DRAINAGE BOARD TO THE RICHLAND COUNTY BOARD AS SETTLEMENT IN FULL.

MR. VERNON M. JOHNSON, REPRESENTING THE HOLDERS OF THE OUTSTANDING DRAINAGE WARRANTS STATED THAT REGARDLESS OF WHETHER OR NOT EACH COUNTY HAD PAID ITS FULL SHARE OF THE COST OF THE DRAIN, THERE WERE STILL OUTSTANDING WARRANTS WHICH ARE NOT PAID AND WHICH, IN HIS OPINION, ARE A LIEN AGAINST THE DISTRICT AND SHOULD BE PAID.

AN EXCHANGE OF LEGAL OPINIONS BY THE ATTORNEYS PRESENT FOLLOWED BUT NO DEFINITE CONCLUSIONS WERE REACHED.


