THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING WERE READ.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS READ.

COMMISSIONER MARQUETTE SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER KIEFER MOVED THAT THE BOARD APPROVE THE SALE OF LOT 16, BLOCK 8 IN VILLAGE OF COGSWELL TO VILLAGE OF COGSWELL FOR A CONSIDERATION OF \$40.00; TERMS CASH.

ALSO THAT A DEED BE ISSUED TO GUY ANDERSON COVERING SWA OF SEC. 2-129-58 IN LIEU OF ORIGINAL

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

On motion the Board approved the report of Sheriff L. R. Kerling of delinquent personal property taxes collected during the month of July, 1951, in the sum of \$1,340.11.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE OFFER OF THE CHICAGO, MILWAUKEE, ST. PAUL AND PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY, TO SELL ALL OF ITS ABANDONED RIGHT OF WAY BETWEEN BRAMPTON AND COGSWELL, CONTAINING 99 ACRES FOR A CONSIDERATION OF \$5.00 PER ACRE BE ACCÉPTED AND THAT NO TAXES BE SPREAD AGAINST THIS PROPERTY AFTER THE DATE OF ITS ABANDONMENT.

Commissioner Kiefer seconded the motion and same carried.

THE BOARD PRODECTED TO OPEN AND CONSIDER BIDS FOR THE FURNISHING OF SUPPLIES FOR THE PRIMARY AND GENERAL ELECTIONS TO BE HELD IN 1952, AS ADVERTISED.

BIDS HAD BEEN FILED BY THE KNIGHT PRINTING COMPANY AND THE THE GLOBE-GAZETTE PRINTING COMPANY

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE BID OF GLOBE-GAZETTE PRINTING CO., SAME HAVING BEEN FOUND TO BE THE LOWEST AND BEST, BE ACCEPTED AND THE CONTRACT FOR FURNISHING ELECTION SUPPLIES FOR THE YEAR 1952 BE AWARDED TO SAID COMPANY.

COMMISSIONER MARQUETTE SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD NEXT PROCEEDED TO OPEN AND CONSIDER BIDS FOR THE SALE OF AN AULTMAN-TAYLOR TRACTOR, AS ADVERTISED.

A BID IN THE SUM OF \$60.00 HAD BEEN SUBMITTED BY LESLIE BROWN. ON MOTION THE ABOVE BID WAS REJECTED BY THE BOARD.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS, Otter Tail Power Company, a Minnesota corporation, duly licensed to do business within the State of North Dakota, and engaged generally in the business of generation, transmission and distribution of electric energy, has applied for the grant of a right of way over and upon the highways and public
grounds under the care and supervision of the Board of County Commissioners of Sargent County; and this Board
having duly considered the matter;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SAID COUNTY, THAT SAID APPLICATION BE, AND THE SAME IS HEREBY GRANTED, AND THERE IS HEREBY GRANTED TO OTTER TAIL POWER COMPANY, A MINNESOTA CORPORATION, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, THE RIGHT OF WAY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATION OF AN ELECTRIC LIGHT SYSTEM, INCLUDING THE CONSTRUCTION, OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF TRANSMISSION AND DISTRIBUTION LINES, OVER AND UPON ANY PUBLIC GROUNDS, STREETS, OR HIGHWAYS UNDER THE CARE OR SUPERVISION OF SAID BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITING THE GENERALITY OF THE FOREGOING, ALL COUNTY HIGHWAYS AND HIGHWAYS AND HIGHWAYS IN UNORGANIZED TERRITORIES IN SAID COUNTY, BUT NOT INCLUDING ANY STREETS OR HIGHWAYS WHICH LIE WITHIN THE LIMITS OF ANY ORGANIZED CITY OR VILLAGE.

The right of way hereby granted shall be subject to the following conditions, restrictions and regulations, viz: The pole line shall be located upon the highways so as to least inconvenience the use of the highways by the public. The Board may designate the place within the highway limits where the pole lines shall be located, and after the pole line has been constructed, if the highway is widened or improved, the Board may, upon thirty days' notice in writing to the Grantee, require the Grantee to move its pole line to a new location within the highway limits, provided, however, that the Grantee shall not be required to so move its pole line more than one time during the term of this right of way without compensation being paid to the Grantee for such moving. The construction, operation and maintenance of such pole line shall also be subject to such reasonable police regulations as this Board may from time to time prescribe. Such pole lines and particularly shall be constructed and maintained in accordance with usual and approved Standards of Construction.

This right of way is applied for and granted pursuant to the North Dakota Revised Code, 1943, Section 49-0916, as amended; and the right of way hereby granted shall be for a period of twenty (20) years from the date of the passage of this resolution.

THE SECRETARY OF THE COUNTY PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD,
BE IT HEFEBY RESOLVED THAT AN EMERGENCY EXISTS AND THAT THE SUM OF \$6,000.00 BE TRANSFERRED

FROM THE COUNTY EMERGENCY FUND TO THE POOR FUND." COMMISSIONER MARQUETTE SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED.

COMMISSIONER MARQUETTE MOVED THAT THE SUM OF \$2,000.00 BE TRANSFERRED FROM THE COUNTY POOR FUND TO THE SOCIAL WELFARE FUND.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE IN SPECIAL SESSION, CALLED BY THE CHAIRMAN FOR THE PURPOSE OF APPRAISING AND ACQUIRING RIGHT OF WAY FOR HIGHWAY PROJECT SAP-147 (Highway No. 13, Milnor City 3 miles south) with all members present except Commissioner Kiffer.

THE BOARD JOHRNEYED TO MILNOR, ACCOMPANIED BY DAN SMITH, DISTRICT ENGINEER OF THE STATE HIGH-WAY DEPARTMENT AND PROCEEDED TO APPRAISE LAND NEEDED FOR RIGHT OF WAY AND TO INTERVIEW THE OWNERS OF SAME.

Commissioner Marquette offered the following resolution, and, seconded by Commissioner WALSTEAD, MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS, THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT CONTEMPLATES THE IMPROVEMENT OR CONSTRUCTION OF A PART OF ITS HIGHWAY SYSTEM WITHIN THIS COUNTY IN CONNECTION WITH WHAT IS KNOW AS HIGHWAY PROJECT SAP-147 (HIGHWAY No. 13, Milnor City 3 miles south), and such improvement or construction will require the acquisition by the STATE OF LANDS FOR RIGHT OF WAY OR BORROW PITS WITHIN THE COUNTY.

BE IT. THEREFORE, RESOLVED that this county pay fifty percent (50%) of the actual cost of SUCH LANDS, WHETHER ACQUIRED BY CONDEMNATION PROCEEDINGS OR BY DIRECT PURCHASES FROM THE OWNERS OF THE SAME, INCLUDING SUCH SUMS AS MAY BE PAID AND ALLOWED SUCH OWNERS ON ACCOUNT OF DAMAGES TO IMPROVEMENTS, REMOVAL OF IMPROVEMENTS OR OTHER ALLOWABLE DAMAGES UNDER THE LAW OF EMINENT DOMAIN OF THIS STATE, INCLUDING LANDS AC-QUIRED BY PURCHASE AT WHAT IS DEEMED A REASONALBE VALUATION BY THE STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT IF SAID LANDS TO BE ACQUIRED FOR HIGHWAY PURPOSES ARE ACQUIRED BY THIS COUNTY OR ITS BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR AND IN BEHALF OF THE STATE, AND PAID FOR WITH COUNTY FUNDS, THE COUNTY AUDITOR SHALL PRESENT, AS SOON AS CONVENIENTLY MAY BE AFTER SUCH PAYMENT, TO THE STATE Highway Department, Proper voucher for reimbursement to this county of fifty percent (50%) of the county FUNDS SO EXPENDED THEREFOR; AND, IF SAID LANDS OR ANY OF THEM ARE ACQUIRED AND PAID FOR BY THE STATE, OR IT STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, THE AUDITOR IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO DRAW AND DELIVER TO THE STATE Highway Department due and proper county warrant of this county for fifty percent (50%) of the actual total COST OF SAID LANDS SO PAID FOR BY THE STATE OR ITS STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.

ALL MEMBERS PRESENT VOTED IN FAVOR OF SAID RESOLUTION. AND THE SAME WAS DECLARED

DULY CARRIED AND ADOPTED.
