Lyle Bopp, State's Attorney, arrived at the meeting.

Sandy Hanson, Tax Director/911 Coordinator met with the Board & reviewed several Applications for Abatement or Refund of taxes. The first abatement was on property belonging to Ashly Odegard in Milnor City's Renaissance Zone. Legal description as follows: Lots 21-22, Block 26, Original Motion to concur with Milnor City's approval of abatement. Townsite, Milnor City. (Anderson/Jacobson, unanimous) The second abatement was on Mark & Diane Pierson's property in Forman City. Legal description as follows: Lots 8-9, Block 31, First Addition, Forman City. Motion to concur with Forman's City's denial of abatement based on the fact that it is in line with similar properties in the area. (Anderson/Wyum, unanimous) The third abatement was a home that was torn down on the Bradley Swanson/Harvey Fiala property in Forman City. Legal Description as follows: Lots 10 & S1/2 Lot 11, Block 48, First Addition, Forman City. Motion to concur with Forman City's approval of abatement. (Walstead/Anderson, unanimous) The final abatement was Kim Houle's property in Stirum. Legal Description as follows: Lots 3-4 less 10' on North side, Block 1, Randall's Addition, Village of Stirum. It was a mobile home that had been taxed as residential, but moved off the site in 2009. Motion to concur with Vivian Township's approval of abatement. (Anderson/Wyum, Sandy also updated the board on finding a site for the new repeater. It would cost approximately \$200 per site for a feasibility study. Sandy will gather more information for a future meeting. Sandy also handed out sample packets she will be mailing out to rural residents to file for Farm Residence Exemptions. These packets will be mailed out within the next few weeks.

Motion to write for an extension on the permit that allows the shooting of muskrats within the road right-of-ways be renewed, and that the County Auditor be instructed to request a renewal of said permit each year until and unless the County commission instructs otherwise or the State law, rules or regulations no longer allow such a permit. (Anderson/Wyum, unanimous)

Sparky Engquist, Road Supt, updated the Board on various road issues and answered questions the board had for him regarding bills received for payment.

Proceeded to open bids for furnishing supplies for the year beginning April 1, 2011, and ending March 31, 2012, as advertised. Present: DarWayne Crandall, Crandall Construction, Cayuga; Rustad's Sand & Gravel, Kindred; and Merrill (Sparky) Engquist, Road Supt. Bids submitted as follows:

**GRAVEL:** Crandall Construction, Cayuga; Arrowhead Transport Inc., Gwinner; Bernard Mahrer Construction Inc., Rutland; Mark Sand and Gravel Dakota Co., Fergus Falls, MN; Enderson Construction, Gwinner; & Rustad's Sand & Gravel, Kindred. Accept all bids. (Wyum/Anderson, unanimous)

MIXING & DRYING BLACKTOP SURFACING: No bid received.

**BITUMINOUS MATERIALS:** Flint Hills Resources, West Fargo, ND. Accept bid. (Walstead/Jacobson, unanimous)

**GASOLINE, FUEL, & LP GAS:** Dakota Plains Cooperative, Lisbon; Nelson Bulk Oil Company, Milnor; Rutland Oil Co., Rutland; Ed's Place, Forman; & Full Circle Ag, Britton, SD. Accept all bids. (Anderson/Jacobson, unanimous)

The Board recessed for lunch at 12:00 noon.

The Board reconvened at 1:00 with Jim Bosse, Richard Engst, and Mark Breker, Sargent County Water Resource Board; Damon DeVillers, Interstate Engineering; Lyle Bopp, State's Attorney; Sparky Engquist, Road Supt; & Bruce Speich present. Damon updated the Board on 2010 Detailed Damage Inspection Reports (DDIR). There were three sites allowed for permanent restoration costs. He was instructed to come to the next meeting with estimates of the breakdown of these permanent restoration costs. Damon reported that there are additional monies available for bridge work. Motion to direct Damon to start the process for possible bridge replacement in Hall Township regarding Bridge #'s 41-135-06.0, 41-135-05.0, and 41-135-05.1 (Wyum/Walstead, unanimous) Damon stated again the importance of getting documentation of FAS road damage, for instance, pictures before & after repairs.

The Water Board invited the commission to attend a Richland/Sargent #1Joint Board meeting March 29 at 9:30 a.m. at Cayuga City Hall. This is an informational meeting regarding their upcoming project of replacing two crossings in Sargent County and the easements needed for the project.

Bruce Speich was at the meeting regarding the project done on County Road #14 last fall. He believes that the ditch wasn't cleaned out properly and the project was unfinished, therefore, there is water backing up onto his land. Sparky stated that the reason it wasn't finished is that there was telephone wire that needed to be moved in order to complete this project.

Harvey Kleingarn met with the Board regarding the light fixtures in the courthouse. The U.S. Government will be banning the manufacturing of all T12 fluorescent lamps as of July 14, 2012. There is a \$24,000 grant available at this time to replace the fixtures. Motion to replace the light fixtures in the courthouse and that the courthouse commissioner is instructed to choose the style of lamps purchased. (Anderson/Wyum, unanimous)

Sandy Hanson met again with the Board with emergency management updates. Motion to approve Sandy to remain on the list for Emergency Management Liaison for the state Disaster Emergency Services. (Wyum/Jacobson, unanimous)

Steve reported that questionnaires had been sent out to other counties for information on the 2011 Market Survey.

The Board discussed the Cogswell-Brampton road right-of-way block sale concept proposal. Lyle stated that some of the landowners were unwilling to help pay for the survey. The Board discussed different options, but no decision was made.

Jerry updated the commission on the improvements made with the Court Facilities Grant. The chair has been fixed in the courtroom, and in the judge's chamber, the doors have been swapped out, sheet rocking done between there & the lunch room, peephole installed & the phone line has been installed.

Lyle read the revision to the Personnel Policy regarding the Sheriff's Department. Instead of observing holidays that fall on Saturday on the preceding Friday and Sunday on the following Monday, the Sheriff's Department will recognize a holiday on the actual holiday.

Letter received from Vantage Point requesting plowing & directional boring along county and township for construction of buried fiber optic cable on the eastern edge of the county. The proposed cable will provide new & upgraded services to the customers of Red River Rural Telephone Ass'n. Road permit approved for Red River Rural Telephone Ass'n. (Walstead/Jacobson, unanimous)

The Board reviewed a letter received from the ND Highway Patrol regarding weight enforcement on county roads. The NDHP is willing to assist the county in the spring's load restriction period for the year 2011. This assistance is offered with the understanding that the NDHP does not have the ability to patrol the county roads on a routine basis but will assist as time and resources permit. Motion to send letter of request to the ND Highway Patrol. (Walstead/Anderson, unanimous)
