The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met in the Commissioner's Room at the Sargent County Courthouse at 10:00 a.m., following the park board meeting, with the following members present: Jason Arth; Bill Anderson; Dave Jacobson; Sherry Hosford; and, Mike Walstead. Also present was Merrill Engquist, Road Supervisor; Bruce Berg, Butler Machinery; Troy Mahler, RDO Equipment; Jayne Pfau, Assistant State's Attorney; Tibby Hinderlie, Sargent County Teller; and, Pam Maloney, Sargent County Auditor.

The Board proceeded to open and read bids for the acquisition of One Motor Grader – New 2018 Model or Low hour 2017 Model consistent with the county's specifications. Bids were received from RDO Equipment Co., Fargo, ND; and Butler Machinery Co., Fargo, ND. Company representatives were present for the bid opening. Discussion was held concerning the options with each machine in the various bids and possible delivery dates if a bid is accepted. The road supervisor and the commission will review each bid and a decision will be made at the next meeting.

Andy Seyer; Steve Ringdahl; and, Ryan Reiswig; Verner Township Supervisors; arrived at the meeting to discuss 2 miles of township road (between Section 19/30 and 20/29). Verner Township would like to turn over those 2 miles to the county. The 2 miles run from Sargent County #2 to the east end of a Dickey County Road that terminates at the county line. The road is heavily used by farm trucks hauling farm commodities to grain handling facilities in Oakes. According to the township supervisors it is extremely costly to maintain these two miles, and, because of the high drain assessments in Verner Township, they would really prefer not to raise taxes. There is currently an agreement in place between Verner Township and Sargent County by which the county blades the road and provides snow removal; and the county and township share the cost of the gravel 50/50. The commissioners took no action on the township's request and the agreement will remain as is. The Verner Township Supervisors will meet with the commissioners each year in February to discuss the arrangement. They also mentioned that there is a dangerous intersection in that area that, in their opinion, should be better marked. The road crew will check it out & possibly add a yield sign at the intersection.

Denise Ferderer, Tax Director, arrived at the meeting. There were several applications for abatements of taxes that needed to be addressed. 1) Parcels 23-7111000, 23-7111001, 23-7116000, 23-7116001 & 31-9507000 – the applicant, Richard H Beaver, requested the 5% discount for payment of the 2017 real estate taxes, which were paid February 26, 2018. In order to receive the discount, the taxes must be paid by February 15. The applicant states that they did not receive their 2017 tax statements until after February 15 as they had moved from Gwinner to Fargo in 2016, and the 2017 statements were sent to their old address, returned to Sargent County by the Postal Service and not sent to their current address until it was too late to obtain the discount. When they realized that they had not received their statements, the deadline for the discount had passed. Whitestone Hill Township has approved the application. Motion to deny the application. (Jacobson/Hosford) Roll Call Vote: Yes - Arth, Jacobson, Hosford and Walstead. No – Anderson. Motion carried. Application denied. 2) Parcel 23-7015000 – S1/2 of SW1/4 less 5.74 acre parcel 3-132-56 – Whitestone Hill Township. The applicant, Steve & Caroline Jacobson, requested that the 2016 real estate taxes be abated as the building value for the commercial structure was eliminated as the business closed & ceased as of December 31, 2015. The structure is now considered and used as an agriculture structure on the Jacobson farm. Whitestone Hill Township has approved the application. Motion to concur with the township and approve the application. (Hosford/Anderson) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously. 3) Parcels 26-8835000 - Lots 4-5-6, Block 3, Klefstad's 2nd Subdivision; & 26-8875000 - Lots 1-2, Block 1, Klefstad's 3rd Subdivision; both located in Forman City. The applicant, Forman Housing Authority, is requesting the 2017 taxes be abated as Forman Housing Authority is a governmental entity and therefore tax exempt. Forman City has approved the application. Motion to concur with the city. (Jacobson/Anderson) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously. 4) Parcel 25-7737001 – 1.49 acres in Outlot M, Auditor's Plat, Milnor City. The applicant, Milnor Fire District, is requesting the 2017 taxes be abated as Milnor Fire District is a governmental entity and therefore tax exempt. Milnor City has approved the application. Motion to concur with the city. (Jacobson/Anderson) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously. 5) 03-1526000 – Lots 11-12-13, Block 1, Original Townsite, Crete Village. The applicant, Brian Vculek, is requesting the 2015 structure value be abated as the house was torn down and burned on the lot. Denver Township has approved the application. Motion to concur with the township. There were six additional applications from Milnor City, but the commissioners requested further information, so the applications will be acted on at the May 1 commission meeting.

Merrill Engquist, Road Supervisor, stated that he had met with John Quandt, Dickey County resident; & Jeff Hagen, Dickey County Road Supervisor; regarding some further private drain work that will be done along the Sargent County/Dickey County line. He stated that there will likely be more permit requests within the month.

Motion to approve the gravel project worksheet prepared by Commissioner Arth, in which the county's 2018 graveling work is distributed among the competing contractors in order to get the work done as expeditiously as possible. (Arth/Anderson) Roll Call Vote: Yes – Arth, Anderson, Hosford & Walstead. No – Jacobson. Motion carried.

Approve an Application for a permit to do Drainage Work within County Road Rights-of-Way for Steve Kasowski to install a culvert across County Road #3 on the west side of Section 19 to the east side of Section 18-130-58 Jackson Township on the condition that the applicant supply the culvert, have the work performed as recommended in the hydraulic study, and that the work be done by a licensed, insured & bonded contractor. All work to be performed to the satisfaction of the county road supervisor. (Anderson/Jacobson) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

The auditor was instructed to forward the information regarding the Bridge Inventory Scour and Channel Profile Inspections to the county engineer at Interstate Engineering, Wahpeton, and request that it be completed by the July 14, 2018 deadline.

Motion to authorize the chairman to sign the Funding Agreement for Clerk of Court Services based on .59 fulltime equivalent. (Jacobson/Anderson) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Motion to publish the annual notice concerning County Road Rights of Way in the official newspaper. (Anderson/Arth) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

An email was received from Carol Peterson, Milnor City Economic Development Coordinator, requesting a letter from Sargent County supporting Milnor City's application to the State of North Dakota to extend its Renaissance Zone 15 year program for an additional 5 years. The commission requested that the auditor obtain further information from Milnor City. Tabled until the next meeting.

Forman's CarFest Committee is requesting the use of the courthouse grounds on Saturday, June 16, 2018, for the annual CarFest festivities. The committee has requested approval for: guests to use lawn chairs on the Courthouse grounds; Forman Community Club to serve food; use of electricity; set up picnic tables on lawn; and, to set up Porta-John's in the parking lot. Motion to allow the use of the courthouse grounds and parking lot for CarFest activities on Saturday, June 16, 2018, with the understanding that the serving and/or consuming of alcoholic beverages, including beer, is prohibited on courthouse grounds. (Anderson/Hosford) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

On the advice of legal counsel, the commission accepted that the employee who is required to participate in counseling due to the Hostile Work Environment Case should use one of the county vehicles for travel to and from counseling sessions when available. However, the employee will be paid mileage if one is not available. Also, the employee is not required to take any leave for scheduled appointments. The time needed for the actual counseling session which the employee is required to attend is to be treated as employment time, and the employee will be allowed to use vacation or sick leave for the rest of the time that the employee is absent from regular work activities.
