THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING WERE READ AND ON MOTION APPROVED BY THE BOARD AS READ.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO APPROVE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD BILLS.

THE REPORT OF DEPUTY STATE EXAMINER GLENN L. LUND OF THE EXAMINATION OF THE COUNTY OFFICES, UP TO AUGUST 10, 1946, WAS PRESENTED TO THE BOARD. THE REPORT WAS CAREFULLY STUDIED BY THE BOARD AND DIRECTIONS GIVEN BY THE STATE EXAMINER WERE PROMPTLY COMPLIED WITH. THE COUNTY AUDITOR WAS INSTRUCTED BY THE BOARD TO REPORT TO THE STATE EXAMINER, THE ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN REGARD TO THE INSTRUCTIONS GIVEN IN THE SAID REPORT.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS THE COUNTY TREASURER CARRIES ON HER BANK LEDGER CERTAIN CHECKS WHICH ARE OVER SIX YEARS OLD, AND

WHEREAS THE STATE EXAMINER HAS RECOMMENDED THAT THESE CHECKS BE CANCELED AND HAS ADVISED THE TREASURER TO REQUEST THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, TO PASS A RESOLUTION ORDERING THE CANCELLATION OF SAID CHECKS,

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, THAT THE FOLLOWING DESCRIBED CHECKS BE ORDERED CANCELED AND THE COUNTY TREASURER AUTHORIZED TO CHARGE THE SAME OFF AND MAKE THE NECESSARY ENTRIES ON HER RECORDS TO COMPLETE THE CANCELLATION OF SAID CHECKS:

COMMISSIONER MEINHARDT SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

A MOTION WAS MADE, SECONDED AND CARRIED THAT THE COUNTY LEASE THE CATERPILLAR AND SCRAPER TO E. D. DRESSEL OF THE SOIL CONSERVATION SERVICE, WHEN NOT IN USE.

PETITIONS WERE PRESENTED TO THE BOARD REQUESTING THAT A PATROL GRADER BE KEPT AT FORMAN.

APPLICATIONS WERE RECEIVED FROM SIGUARD GABRIELSON AND JOHN J. SCHUDAR FOR POSITIONS AS OPERATORS OF MOTOR PATROLS.

COMMISSIONER LOUDEN MOVED THAT JOHN J. SCHUDAR BE HIRED AS OPERATOR OF THE MOTOR PATROL LOCATED AT GENESEO.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS THE SPILLWAY OF THE SILVER LAKE DAM IS IN URGENT NEED OF REPAIRS, AND WHEREAS THE STATE WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION HAS MADE A COMPLETE SURVEY OF THE CONDITION OF THE SPILLWAY AND HAS PREPARED AN ESTIMATE OF THE COST OF SUCH REPAIRS WHICH ESTIMATE IS \$1,594.00, AND WHEREAS THE STATE WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION AND THE STATE GAME AND FISH DEPARTMENT EACH HAS AGREED TO FURNISH THE SUM OF \$500.00 TOWARDS THE REPAIRS, PROVIDED THAT SARGENT COUNTY WILL GUARANTEE THE PAYMENT OF THE REMAINING \$594.00,

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED THAT SARGENT COUNTY AGREES TO PAY FOR THE COST OF REPAIRING THE SILVER LAKE SPILLWAY, ANY AMOUNT OVER AND ABOVE \$1,000.00 GUARANTEED BY THE STATE WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION, AND THE STATE GAME AND FISH DEPARTMENT, NOT EXCEEDING \$594.00, AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE STATE WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION BE URGED TO PROCEED WITH THE SAID REPAIRS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE IN ORDER THAT SAME MAY BE COMPLETED BEFORE COLD WEATHER SETS IN.

COMMISSIONER MEINHARDT SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT EXCEPT COMMISSIONERS LOUDEN AND DAWSON,

ON MOTION THE BOARD ORDERED THE SUM OF \$1,200.00 TRANSFERRED FROM THE COUNTY POOR FUND TO THE SOCIAL WELFARE FUND.

ON MOTION THE BOARD APPROVED THE REPORT OF SHERIFF L. R. KERLING, OF DELINQUENT PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES COLLECTED DURING THE MONTH OF AUGUST IN THE AMOUNT OF \$289.42.

PETITIONS WERE FILED WITH THE BOARD SIGNED BY RESIDENTS AND VOTERS OF SARGENT COUNTY, PRAYING THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS TAKE SUCH ACTION AND PROCEDURE AS IS NECESSARY TO VOTE UPON THE QUESTION OF THE ESTABLISHMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF A COUNTY LIBRARY.

SUCH LIBRARY IS TO BE A REVOLVING LIBRARY AND IT IS NOT THE INTENTION TO ESTABLISH A PERMANENT LIBRARY IN ANY PARTICULAR TOWN, CITY, OR VILLAGE IN THE COUNTY BUT TO HAVE A TRAVELING AND REVOLVING LIBRARY FOR THE USE AND BENEFIT OF ALL OF THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY.

THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS INTRODUCED BY COMMISSIONER MEINHARDT, WHO MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS PETITIONS HAVE BEEN FILED WITH THIS BOARD PRAYING THAT THE QUESTION OF ESTABLISHING AND MAINTAINING A TRAVELING AND REVOLVING LIBRARY FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY BE SUBMITTED TO A VOTE BY THE ELECTORS OF SARGENT COUNTY, AND

WHEREAS THE STATE ATTORNEY HAS ADVISED THIS BOARD THAT SAID PETITIONS CONTAIN THE NECESSARY 5% OF THE TOTAL VOTE CAST IN THIS COUNTY AT THE LAST GENERAL ELECTION AND THAT THE LAW HAS BEEN FULLY COMPLIED WITH IN EVERY RESPECT IN SECURING SIGNERS ON SAID PETITIONS, AND IN THE CIRCULATING AND FILING OF THE SAME,

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, THAT THE SAID PETITIONS BE GRANTED AND THAT THE COUNTY AUDITOR BE INSTRUCTED TO CAUSE THE QUESTION OF ESTABLISHING AND MAINTAINING A TRAVELING AND REVOLVING LIBRARY, TO BE PLACED UPON THE BALLOT TO BE VOTED ON AT THE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD NOVEMBER 5TH, 1946.
