THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DICKEY AND RANSOM COUNTIES HAD BEEN INVITED TO MEET WITH THE SARGENT COUNTY BOARD TO DISCUSS AND TO TAKE ACTION ON THE OFFER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO MAKE CERTAIN SURPLUS COMMODITIES AVAILABLE TO NEEDY PERSONS, IN CARLOAD LOTS, AT NO COST, SAVE HANDLING AND TRANSPORTATION COSTS FROM POINT OF STORAGE OR DISTRUBUTION IN NORTH DAKOTA.

ATTENDING THE MEETING ALSO, WERE COUNTY WELFARE BOARD DIRECTORS MRS. MAE ANDERSON OF DICKEY COUNTY; MISS ELIZABETH CAMPBELL OF RANSOM COUNTY AND MRS AGNES KING OF SARGENT COUNTY.

IT WAS AGREED TO REQUEST 7 CARLOADS OF VARIOUS SURPLUS COMMODITIES TO BE DISTRIBUTED BETWEEN THE 3 COUNTIES UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE COUNTY DIRECTORS.

CERTIFICATES OF INDESTEDNESS, 2 5/8% SERIES D-1956,/#3325 0 100M, WITH THE NORTHWESTERN NATIONAL BANK OF MINNEAPOLIS, AS CUSTODIAN, SE APPROVED AS TO SUFFICIENCY, SAME HAVING BEEN APPROVED AS TO FORM BY THE STATE ATTORNEY, AND THAT THE COUNTY AUDITOR BE AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO SURRENDER TO THE SARGENT COUNTY BANK THE RECEIPT AND AGREEMENT OF THE NORTHWESTERN NATIONAL BANK FOR THE ASSETS PLEDGED UNDER THE AGREEMENT JUST EXPIRED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

Commissioner Walstead moved that the Board adjourn sine die. Commissioner Smith beconded the motion and same carried.
