The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met in the Commissioner's Room at the Sargent County Courthouse at 10:05 a.m., following the park board meeting, with the following members present: Bill Anderson; Jason Arth; Sherry Hosford; Dave Jacobson; and, Mike Walstead. Also present were Lyle Bopp, State's Attorney; Travis Paeper, Sheriff; Tibby Hinderlie, Sargent County Teller; and, Pam Maloney, Sargent County Auditor.

Denise Ferderer, Tax Director; & Jim Lunneborg, County Resident; arrived at the meeting to consider applications for tax reductions due to inundated lands within the county. 32 applications were received with a total of 1,322.18 acres. Ten (10) or more contiguous acres must be inundated to be approved as inundated land for tax purposes, in order to be in compliance with the applicable state law. Ms. Ferderer informed the Commission that all applications for inundated lands tax reductions submitted for 2018 complied with the requirements of State Law, and that approval of all of the said applications was recommended. Motion to approve the inundated acres applications as recommended by the tax director. (Anderson/Hosford) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously. Mr. Lunneborg commented that in previous years, his statements have come to him in December without the reduction for the inundated lands, and he has had to file an application for abatement of taxes in order to get the inundated acres tax reduction in the form of a tax refund. He was assured that these statements would be pulled and corrected before mailing this year.

Sheriff Paeper appeared at the meeting to discuss one of the bills he had presented for payment. It was a bill for a meal & lodging for a transient moving through the county. In the past, the Sargent County Food Pantry has been providing this service, but they are no longer able to continue the service. Sheriff Paeper has agreed that funds for the payment of this bill may come out of his travel budget for this one time, only, but doesn't think that the Sheriff's budget is the appropriate source to fund any other requests. It was suggested that the Sheriff confer with the churches in Sargent County to find out if they are willing to donate \$50-100 apiece to set up a line item within the Sheriff's Grants budget to be used only for these circumstances. When these funds are depleted, another request for donations could be made at that time. The Sheriff stated that he would pursue this avenue, and report back to the Commission with a specific proposal for consideration.

Approve August 7, 2018 meeting minutes as corrected. (Anderson/Arth, unanimous)

Motion to approve the appointment of Kaia Mahrer, Rutland, to the school re-organization board for a 3 year term, term ending on June 30, 2021, upon the recommendation of Pam Maloney, Superintendent of Schools Designee. (Anderson/Hosford) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously. Ms. Mahrer replaces Nancy Glarum, who no longer resides in the County, on the School Reorganization Board.

There was much discussion regarding the office space needed for the Emergency Manager, Ambulance Coordinator, States Attorney, Extension Service, Social Services and Health District. Numerous alternatives, including securing office space at locations other than the Courthouse, were discussed, but no decisions were made, and the matter will be further discussed at the next meeting.

Motion to publish weed mowing notice in the official newspaper. (Anderson/Jacobson) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

The auditor's office has received three proposals for a different copy machine. A new machine has been budgeted for 2019, but the office supply company is willing to bring out a different machine as a demo at this time, and if the auditor's office staff is satisfied with it, the county can keep it & pay for it in January of 2019. The auditor was advised to choose the option she concludes will do the best job for her office and staff.

Approve August payroll in the sum of \$204,699.89 (Nos. 15244-15308 & 77387-77397) and the following bills: (Hosford/Jacobson) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Merrill Engquist, Road Supervisor, arrived at the meeting. He reported that the centerline and edge striping has all been completed on the safety project, but there is still some signing that remains to be finished. The Safety Project was a 90%/10% cost share, with 90% being paid with funds provided by the federal government, and 10% being paid with county taxpayer funds. Graveling is still at the half-way point. Road department employee Scott Redenius has given 2 weeks notice and submitted his resignation, so the road department is looking for two employees at this time. There have been a few applicants that Mr. Engquist, Road Commissioner Jacobson & State's Attorney Bopp will be contacting to set up interviews. Mr. Engquist stated that low wages compared to other employment opportunities in the area is the main reason that good employees are leaving the county's employment, and that he would really like to see the road department's wages increased to a more competitive level. The commission is waiting to see what the salary/market survey indicates and recommends. Mr. Engquist also stated that there are some townships that are putting up minimum maintenance signs on county traffic signs. The errant townships will be directed to properly post their signs, and to remove them from the county signs. Mag chloride will soon be applied in areas that had not been done with the first application.

Motion to approve Pledge of Assets as provided by Alison Toepke, Treasurer/Recorder/Clerk of Court, showing \$12,395,000 at Sargent County Bank, Forman ND, for 2018. (Hosford/Jacobson) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Discussion was held on the 911 fee to be increased to \$2/line. The commission proposes the continuation of the existing 911 fee and directs that the following measure be placed on the county ballot for the statewide general election scheduled for November 6, 2018: Should the current emergency services communication fee of up to \$1.50 per month per wireless access line and telephone access line for the operation and maintenance of the emergency 911 communications systems be continued? Voter approval would allow a fee, not to exceed \$2.00 per month per wireless (cellular) access line and telephone access line, with the revenue dedicated to maintaining and operating the emergency services communication system as required by State law. A "YES" vote means the voter approves the continuation of the fee. A "NO" vote means the voter does not approve the continuation of the fee. (Hosford/Anderson) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.
