Petition from residents and voters of township 132, Range 54, asking to have said Township organized into a civil township, was presented.

Motion made, and carried, to grant the petition; that the boundaries of said Township be the lines of the congressional township of 132, range 54; that the name of said Township be: "Civil Township of Milnor" that an election will be held in S. Henderson's Office, in the town of Milnor, Sargent County D. S. on the 6th day of March A. D. 1888 for the purpose of electing the proper officers of Civil Township of Milnor, the judges of said election to be: J. B. Andrews, W. S. Wolfe and S. Henderson, and the auditor is instructed to cause to be printed and published proper notices of said election.

Petition from Wm J. Maloney to refund his personal property tax of 1887, for the reason that he did not move into this Territory until the 6th day of April said year, was presented.

Motion made to reject the petition, on the grounds that the owner of the property resided in Sargent County on the first day of May in said year, and there is nothing showing in the petition that the petitioner did not own said property on the first day of April, seconded and carried.

The board instructed the auditor to draw warrants to judges and clerks of the annual election of 1887, of the civil townships.
