The following resolution was introduced by Early.

Whereas at the January session of the board of County Commissioners it was thought best not to appoint a County Physician for the ensuing year owing to the fact among others that all the physicians in the County resided at a point not accessible to a large part of the County and Whereas the expenses attending the proper medical attendance of the County poor are increasing to such an extent as to render a return to the County physician system a matter of economy and necessity

Resolved that Dr. H. W. Emanuel be appointed County Physician for Sargent County for the space of one year at the salary of \$500; provided that said Emanuel shall within two weeks open an office in Torman in said County, and shall as soon as practicable, remove his family to and become an actual and continual resident of said Torman, and that he shall at all proper times respond to all calls from

the proper county officials to attend to County charges and shall render all necessary medical and surgical attendance in such cases, and in case of any neglect upon his part, to respond and properly attend, he shall receive no salary from the County during the month in which such neglect occurs.

Moved to adopt the resolution. Motion put without a second:
