Resolved, That the July settlement with the Treasurer be published in one newspaper, as required by law; that the county auditor be instructed to award such printing to the paper which will publish the same for the price.

On motion the resolution was adopted unanimously.

Moved to appropriate \$10000 or so much thereof as is necessary, out of the bridge fund for bridging at slough between sections 17 and 30-130-56.

Carried.

On motion \$5000 or so much thereof as is necessary was appropriated out of the bridge fund for the purpose of repairing on section 84-130-53. Said amount to be expended by Austin King, and paid for on report of commissioner Sherman.

Petition from residents in Hamlin, asking to have a bridge built across the Wild Rice River between sections 30 and 31-130-53, was presented. Said petition signed by 17 petitioners.

On motion the petition was laid on the table.

Offer of James Thomas of grading a slough on section line between sections 23 and 24, 130-53, for the sum of \$5000, was referred commissioner Sherman, who has to report at the meeting of the board.

On motion the sum of \$5000 be appropriated out of bridge fund for the purpose of grading a slough on the section line between sections 4 and 9, 130-56.

Moved by Gady that the balance on hand in the sinking fund be transferred to the general county fund.

Petition from citizens of Harlem asking to have said village incorporated, was presented. Petition signed by 12 petitioners.

After reading and filing petition from citizens of Harlem, in this county, asking that the village of Harlem may become incorporated under the general law, and it appearing by satisfactory proof by affidavits that all the requirements of law in relation thereto have been fully complied with, and that the census map and survey required by law, have been duly exhibited,

It is hereby ordered, that by and with the consent of the qualified voters residing in the territory proposed for incorporation, as by law provided, the territory in such petition specified, shall become an incorporated town under the name of Town of Harlem, and it is further ordered that an election be held in said town on the 31st day of July, A. D. 1888, at the school-house in said town, to determine whether or not such territory shall become an incorporated town.
