Resolution. preamble The following resolution was introduced, and on motion adopted, and the Auditor instructed to forward a copy thereof to Hon. M. M. Johnson, our Member of Congress, viz:

Whereas, The ten mile indemnity belts North and South of the Northern Pacific Rail Road takes in a great quantity of land in this State, as well as a large quantity of land in the Counties thereof; and

Whereas, Only a small portion of the same has been patented by the United States Government to the Rail Roads, and in many thickly settled districts in the Counties of this State, this land is withheld from settlement, neither the Rail Roads nor the Government having the disposal of it, and this situation being very detrimental to the interests of this State at large, leaving a large portion of the land vacant and exempt from taxation, which ought to bear its proportion of the burdens of taxation; and this exemption from taxation being an injustice to the settlers of this State who in good faith develop and improve our Country; be it
