Be It Resolved, That all noxious weeds, in the County of Sargent and state of North Dakota, except the noxious weed known as the Russian Cactus, shall be destroyed by the persons and corporations owning or occupying lands in said County, upon which the same may be, in such manner as will effectually prevent such weeds from growing into seed between the 20th day of May and the 20th day of June, A.D. 1894.
