List No. 1 shows all moneys that have been paid by the present Treasurer on account of private redemption money received by Treasurer Gaiser.

You will notice, that this list is divided into two parts
The first part aggregating \$567.60 was paid, Cash left with A. M. Groner, by J. D. Gaiser for that purpose.
The second part of this list, aggregating \$477.45 has been paid^{out} by A. M. Groner, treasurer, as shown by the list, but has not yet been paid to the County by Mr Gaiser.

List No. 2 shows redemptions received by Mr Gaiser, for which I am unable to find vouchers of any kind to show that certificates have been surrendered and the money paid. I have instructed your County auditor to write to the holders of certificates, in this list, and in all cases where they can produce the certificate, the amount of redemption as listed will be due from Mr Gaiser
