The Town Clerk shall destroy such tails and certify the number thereof to the County Auditor, who shall thereupon draw his warrant upon the County Treasurer for the amount due, the same to be charged to the Gopher Destruction Fund of the County.

Mr Gaiser appeared again before the Board, while in lawful session assembled, and submitted the following offer of stipulation, and settlement, in the matter of the shortage in the Private Redemption account, to wit:

Forman, N.D. April 26th 1895

To the Hon. Board of County Commissioners of Sargent County, North Dakota.
Gentlemen; I hereby tender you a Warranty Deed for the North East quarter of Section 22, Township 131 Range 55, containing 160 acres more or less, and I agree to clear the title to the said land in reference to a certain sale on execution, to the Van Brunt & Wilkins, Mfg Co. for \$75⁰⁰ and costs, and also in addition to the above lands, the sum \$250⁰⁰ in Cash, for the purpose of settling in full any and all shortage, due Sargent County on account of the shortage in the Private Redemption Fund, during my two terms as Treasurer of said Sargent County, with the express understanding that my bondsmen, and Mr A. M. Gomer, the present Treasurer shall be released from any and all liabilities on account of said shortage.

Which motion prevailed, all members voting aye. The amount of two hundred and fifty (\$250⁰⁰) dollars in Cash was received by the board from Mr Gaiser, and on motion the said amount was ordered deposited with the County Treasurer, and in accordance therewith was deposited with A. M. Gomer, County Treasurer to the credit of the fund known as the Private Redemption Fund. The Warranty Deed herewith accepted, the Auditor was instructed to cause the same to be recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for the County of Sargent, and when so recorded, file the same in the office of the County Auditor. And in consideration of the aforesaid land and amount of cash, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the bondsmen on the said bond of J. D. Gaiser as Treasurer of Sargent County, be and the same are each and everyone released from all further liabilities in the aforesaid shortage.
