Gopher Bounty for 1900.

The following resolution was presented and read viz:-  
Whereas it appears, that there is a large demand for the allowance of a bounty on Gophers during the season of 1900 which desire we believe to be the wish of a majority of the Tax Payers of Sargent County and  
Whereas we deem the wishes of the people to be supreme and that a bounty on gophers is of great benefit to the County, if properly administered:-  
Therefore be it Resolved That the County of Sargent allow and offer a bounty on Gophers for the season of 1900, for each Gopher killed in said County, between the first day of April and the first day of July 1900: That said bounty shall be Two (2) cents for each Gopher killed: the same to be paid out of the Gopher Destruction Fund, hereafter to be created, upon the warrant of the County Auditor: provided that the County Auditor shall issue such warrants, upon
