The board of County Commissioners of Sargent County met in session at the County Auditor's office in the Town of Forman pursuant to adjournment. All members present.

Consideration of Judgement

On motion the regular ^{order} of business was dispensed with, and the Board proceeded to the consideration of Tax Judgements due the County.

J. Nordstrom

John P. Nordstrom appeared before the Board and offered to pay the original amount of the judgement against him, asking the abatement of the interest on same.

On motion the offer of Mr. Nordstrom was accepted, and the County Treasurer is hereby authorized to accept the sum of \$4.50 in full payment of said judgement.

Michael Mazaros

Michael Mazaros appeared before the Board and asked for an extension of time, as it would be impossible for him to pay any at the present and could not pay the whole this year and offered to give his note with Chattel Mortgage security as collateral to the judgement against him providing that the Board would abate the accrued interest to date, said note & mortgage to be made payable on or before Oct 1st 1900.

On motion the offer of Mr. Mazaros was accepted, and the County Treasurer is hereby authorized to accept the sum of \$10.00 in full payment of said judgement, on a note for \$10.00 payable on or before Oct 1st 1900, the same to be held by the County, as collateral to said judgement.

A. P. Brougher & L. W. Gooler

Judgment

J. M. Bergmann appeared before the Board and represented that the judgment against him was null and void for the reason that he never received any service on the complaint, and for the further reason that the four horses which were assessed to him were afflicted with the glanders the year that the tax was levied and were shot by order of the State Veterinarian the same year for which he had received no benefit, use, or pay, and further that the cows in said assessment for the year of 1890 were in fact not his property, but that the record might be cleared he would pay the sum of \$5.00 and interest thereon at 7% per annum from the date of the judgment. It was moved and seconded that the Board accept the sum of \$5.00 in full payment for said judgment and that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized to receive the said \$5.00 and issue his receipt therefor in full satisfaction of said
