The Board in session. All members present.

The minutes of yesterday's session were read and approved.

Mr Marcellus moved that Messrs Straub and Peterson be appointed a committee to inspect the bridges lately built in Weber Gro. P.

Mr Peterson moved that the Auditor and Treasurer be authorized to make settlement of the 1893, 1894, 1895, 1896 and 1897 taxes on lot 1 in Sec. 28, and the 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ % of Sec. 29-131-58, on the basis of the original tax at 7 per cent per annum, and sheriff's fees.
